Description of bird: I was looking over the thousands of waterfowl that were on the lake when I noticed what I thought was a small, white heron flying around near some geese. I watched the bird for the next several minutes as it circled the lake and then took off to the south. Even in flight, I could see that the bird had long, dark legs and a rather thick, yellowish bill. The rest of the bird was entirely white. The bird also struck me as being too short-necked to be a Snowy Egret. The bird also flew with very rapid, even wingbeats which is characteristic of Cattle Egrets.

Similar species and how eliminated: The small size eliminates Great Egret. The heavy, yellowish bill, dark legs, and short-necked appearance eliminates Snowy Egret and immature Little Blue Heron(not very likely at this date anyhow).

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good with the sun behind me. Estimated viewing distance was 100-150 yards most of the time. I used Nikon 8x23 binoculars and a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I have seen numerous Cattle Egrets and the other white herons in Iowa and many other locations.
