We were at the north end of Bays Branch when I spotted this Ibis all by itself. One had been here the weekend before and we were surprised and pleased to see this. later, as we were scoping the lake edges, we saw another Ibis. They were good-sized waders with long, decurved bills. They were brilliontly colored with a magnificent chestnut and green iridescence. On both of these birds we saw a distinctive white strip about the base of the bill.

Similar species and how eliminated: Glossy Ibis does not have a large, noticeable white strip completely about the base of the bill.

Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? <u>No</u>

If yes, explain:

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment: Sunny-sun at our side and behind US. The 1st Ibis was 40-50 yards away and the 2<sup>nd</sup> one was 100 yards away but flew to 70-80 yards away-lestimated. Previous experience with species and similar ones: Nave seen quite a few white faced Ibis-(15 in Kansas in April)- and some Flossys.
