I observed the bird swimming in the lake, half again the size of a pair of Eared Grebe that I had been watching. Bird body was the shape of a loon, but the neck was much more erect, thinner and taller. The over all color was grayish, there was not a white crescent on the side of the face, so judged it to be an immature. The bill was heavy, long and yellow in color. The grayish color seemed to be slightly darker on the top of the head. The bird never flew so did not see the feet.

- 8. Description of behavior: Dove repeatedly from surface of water.
- 9. Habitat general: Lower Pine Lake is small, surrounded by trees, marshy habitat in the upper end of the lake. Small island in the middle. specific: Bird was observed between the island and the marshy area.

Loon, because of the size of the neck and head in comparison to the rest of there body. They have larger body. Western Grebe, has thinner bill.
