Two grebes were riding the waves and facing into the wind and facing my direction. The sun was behind me and to my side and I had good viewing light as sunset approached at 812pm. that evening. Both birds had black caps, white throats and white on the sides of their face, long red necks, and a light yellow bill on one bird and a lightcolored bill on the other one. The red neck on one bird was very striking and not as defined on the other bird, but at sunset both birds looked the same coloration. They had reddish sides somewhat with whitish streaks on the sides. One showed white underneath when it raised and flapped its wings. They had a dark-looking back and back of their necks. They were much larger than eared and horned grebes. They preened but never dived. Both birds had their heads tucked in and rested for a bit approximately 100-120 yards away.

similar species and how eliminated: Horned grebes are much smaller and lack the white throat and cheeks.
