When it flew two white patches showed on each wing. All this indicated a Red-necked Grebe. When we first saw the bird it was across the lake bathing a ruffling its feathers but soon was diving, then flying closer where it alternated diving with swimming.
Similar species and how eliminated: Horned Grebe; this bird had a reddish neck like a Horned, but was much larger & had no golden ear tufts. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification? No
