Describe the bird(s) including only what you observed. Include size, shape, details of all parts (bill. cyc. head, neck, back, wing, tail, throat, breast, belly, undertail, legs, feet). Also mention voice and behavior. Observing shorebirds, we saw a brown heron standing on a log in shellow water. Viewing the bird's right side, its neck was thicker and shorter than a Great Blue Heron's; it stood motionless with an erect posture. We immediately noted the blood- red eye, brown back with white spots, and well-streaked head, neck and breast. Its bill was dark; its shape was thick and stout; the bill appeared heavy. The bird was approximately 24 in. tall. We noted further the scattered small light spots on the darker-brown back. We observed the bird for approximately three minutes. It then flew west-northwest along shoreline, about 12 ft. high, and landed approximately 300 yds from us. We were not able to note the position of the foot relative to the tail during the bird's flight. No call was heard.

Similar species; how eliminated:

Black-crowned Night-Heron (imm) has larger light spots on back and its bill is less stout.
