If you are interested, information on our season, reprinted from one of our internet posts, follows. This is the unofficial raptor (and vulture) count for the 1999 Fall Season. I'm still working on the non-raptor totals which, frankly, are a bit less scientific and a bit more educated guesswork. We have already forwarded our "brief documentation" sightings (Prairie Falcons, Sandhill Crane, etc) to Ann Johnson via e-mails. I believe that you have already received the documentation on our 1st ever Black-billed Magpie record from Sue and Howard Mattix. The Black-billed Magpie, Ferruginous Hawk, and Pomarine Jaeger sightings were our best 3 birds of the millions seen during the 391 count hours we logged.

The Hitchcock Nature Area Hawkwatch (HNAH) is affiliated with the Hawk Migration Association of North America and is located at Hitchcock Nature Area in the Loess Hills on the lowa side of the lowa-Nebraska border overlooking the Missouri River Valley. The watch is easily accessible from the intersection of Interstate Highways 680 and 29; take lowar 988 into the town of Crescent, Iowa. From Crescent, take Route 183 north to HNA. Some counting has been done at HNA since 1992. This year, counting of raptors, vultures and other migrants is being done on a part-time basis during the September 1-December 20 period. There are three watchpoints at HNA; most counting, however, has been done from the deck of the park's lodge. HNA will remain an undercounted site until staffing improves or a higher vantage point is created.
