Near the C51 entrance to Big Marsh north of Parkersburg tonight was =
watching a group of 8 Great Blue Herons, about 20 Killdeer, and about 30 =
assorted other shorebirds which appeared to be Least, Solitary, Spotted, =
and Pectoral Sandpipers. These were in the ponds on the west side of the =
dike. Then on the other side I heard loud rattling calls and there were =
2 Sandhill Cranes with bright red crowns. They strutted about for about =
20 minutes calling and occasionally showing their wings before flying =
out across the marsh. =20
