Spring 1980 birds. NE Mills Co., Iowa.

- ✓ Common Loon - hardly unusual in the area, but the one at Willow Slough April 21 looked almost as out of place as a loon on a mud puddle. One in breeding plumage at the Slough May 27 + 28
- ✓ Eared Grebes - at Willow Slough at least March 22 - May 2.
- ✓ Horned Grebe - 1 at Riverton May 10 (seen with Ross Silcock + BJ Rose)
- Pied-billed Grebe - Eric Joransen reports that the ice went out at Lake Manawa (Council Bluffs) March 15 and that Grebes were on the lake late that same afternoon
- ✓ Double-crested Cormorant: 1-7 present at Willow Slough ~~in~~
April 18 - May 7. 3 at Forney's lake May 29.
- ✓ Green Heron - 3 at Willow Slough May 19
- ✓ Common Egret - 1 at Willow Slough May 24
- * Geese: First heard March 14. White-fronts and to a lesser extent Canadas were very noticeable and common this spring.
- ✓ Ross's Grouse - 1 March 21 with probably over 1,000 Snow Geese.

- Mallard - tan, very pale, individual accompanies ♂ Mallard
April 7, Willow Slough.
- ✓ Whistling Swan - 4 at Willow Slough March 21
- Wood Duck - 5 ducklings on Wilson farm, NE Mills County, May 22.
♀ with ± 6 ducklings on an interstate highway in downtown Omaha Nebraska May 15. I hope she knew where she was going.
- ✓ Canvasback - still present at Willow Slough May 19 (♂?)
- C. Goldeneye - I was surprised to find them in shallow Willow Slough this spring. The last one was April 25.
- Ruddy Duck - see documentation of very strange individual.
- Hooded Mergansers - March 21 - Apr. 25 at Willow Slough.
- Red-breasted Merganser - 1 ♀ ^{at least} on Willow Slough April 18. (Common ♀'s were also present that day)
- ✓ Bald Eagle: 1 adult at Lake Manawa March 20. 1 adult + 4 immature at Willow Slough April 2. (adult kills a coot + 3 young ^{eagles} pursue it April 3, Willow

Rough-legged Hawk - Ed Greenwood reports one March 24 in NE Mills County. I don't know how he ident'd it. Ed St.

Slough. 1 adult at Wilson Farm, NE Mills County, April 5.

- ✓ Bobwhite - good population in Mills County
- ✓ Piping Plover - 1 at Willow Slough May 21
- Killdeer - a cheerful sign of spring March 15, NE Mills County
- ✓ American Woodcock - Ross Silcock located displaying males at Riverton Game Management area, Fremont County, Iowa. They displayed at least from early May - May 10, when he took BJ Rose & me to ^{hear} ~~see~~ them.
- ✓ Willet - 5 at Willow Slough April 25
- Stilt Sandpiper - 2⁺ at Willow Slough May 19
- ✓ American Avocet - 2 at Willow Slough May 7
- ✓ Northern Phalarope - 1 at Willow Slough May 21. An amazing? at the slough May 24
- ✓ Franklin's Gull - at Willow Slough April 3, April 4, May 7, May 27
- ✓ Bonaparte's Gull - 2 at Willow Slough May 7
- ✓ Common Tern - 3 at Willow Slough May 19 and 10 on May 24.
- ✓ Forster's Tern - some at the slough various times at least from May 2 to May 19. This year I found more ^{Commons} ~~Forsters~~ than Forsters. That never happened before.
- Black Tern - over 100 on the slough May 19.
- ✓ Caspian Tern - 1 at Willow Slough May 24, where it ate a Black Bullhead.

Barned Owl - a fledgling accompanied by at least one parent at Wilson Farm, NE Mills County, May 2+3.

Great Horned Owl - flightless young bird accompanied by parent north of Riverton May 10. (with Ross Silcock & BJ Rose)

- ✓ ~~Pileated Woodpecker~~ - Ed Greenwood reports seeing one at Willow Slough last spring. Described it well!
- ✓ Red-shafted Flicker - 1 (or a hybrid) with 10 yellow-shafted flickers in a flock at Willow Slough April 7. Uncommon on Missouri flood plain 20 miles away. Very rare here.
- ✓ Western Kingbird - 1 at Willow Slough May 21.
- ✓ Alder Flycatcher - 6 heard on ~~the~~ Wilson Farm, NE Mills County, on May 26.

- ✓ Willow Flycatcher - singing birds at Willow Slough, where they are summer residents, by May 21
- ✓ Olive-sided Flycatcher - 1 on Wilson Farm, NE Mills County, on May 21.
- Black-capped Chickadee - 1 foraging at fruiting heads of Cattail in a cattail bed at Willow Slough April 15.
- ✓ Hermit Thrush - 1 on May 3, Wilson Farm, NE Mills County
- Gray-cheeked Thrush - 1 on May 21, Wilson Farm, NE Mills County.
- ✓ Eastern Bluebird - 4 pairs are probably nesting on the farm, 3 in nest boxes. ~~1~~ One nest failed early, + was taken over by House Sparrows. I don't know if the sparrows evicted the Bluebirds or not. ~~As a result 8 pairs have fledged 13 young~~ ~~for a clutch of~~ This pair was searching for a new nest + is still ~~in~~ around, so they probably have renested. A second pair fledged 3 young from a clutch of five eggs. A third is now feeding a brood of five in the nest.
- Warbling ~~Vireo~~ Vireo nest in Silver Maple found May 22, when it was being built, at Wilson Farm, NE Mills County.
- ✓ Orange-crowned Warbler: first I found was April 21 at the Wilson Farm, Mills County.
- Blackburnian Warbler - Tacye Pedersen described a lovely male in her huckleberry bush May 15. NE Mills County.
- ✓ Louisiana Water Thrush - 1 at ~~Lake~~ ~~water~~ Wilson farm, NE Mills County, May 16.
- American Redstart - I found ♂ and singing ♀'s at Willow Slough, where they bred last year, on May 16 (and since)
- ✓ Warblers in general ~~are~~ arrived a few days late this year. The trees, on the other hand, ~~are~~ encouraged by our warm April, leafed out early. These tiny birds are very hard to find behind big leaves. They were only here in good numbers for a few days around the 17th + 18th of May, too.

Rusty Blackbirds were present in the winter on the farm (NE Mills County) and I found them regularly until March 17, and again from March 31 to April 15.

Blue Grosbeak - ♂ May 10 on Hwy 275 south of council Bluff (Pottawattamie County). (Seen with Ross Silcock & B.J. Rose, who found it).

- ✓ Swamp Sparrows - 1 May 19 at Willow Slough, late?
- ✓ Clay-colored Sparrows - single birds at Willow Slough April 25, 28, and May 16.

Birds out of Order

- ✓ Eared Grebe - 1 in a flock of 13 Ruddy Ducks May 30. June 1 it was keeping a single Ruddy Company.
 - ✓ White Pelican - 2 at Willow Slough May 30
 - ✓ White-fronted Goose - 1 at Willow Slough May 30.
- Snow/Blue Geese - 16 appeared at the Slough May 30. They weren't there before.
- X Tufted Duck - Eric Toransen reports 1 at Lake Manawa March 15. He is not always extremely cautious in identifying birds, but he had a bird book along & insists he saw the long drooping crest as the bird shook itself. That's about the only useful field mark he reported.

Scamp (probably lesser) - a ♀ bird at the slough lacked the white ring at the base of the bill. Confusing!

Shrikes, presumably Loggerhead - 2 in rural Pottawattamie County April 10, but surprisingly she found no nests so far.

Bell's Vireo - present as usual at Willow slough.
