In flight, the bird folded its nech up, a typical trait of egrets. I was not able to pick out the yellow feet in flight or when it landed, due to distance and light. Similar species and how eliminated: Told from other egrets and Little Blue Heron by slender black bill and black legs, and size. Did any one disagree or have reservations about identification?
