mid-sized egret, plumage all white. Three points stood out when I looked at the bird:
a. At least one and perhaps all three of the birds had conspicuous long lacy plume feathers on the back.
b. The legs of all three birds were black but the feet were yellow-this feature was specifically looked for and seen on all three birds
c. The bill was straight, relatively thin, and dagger-like (color not noted). I have seen literally hundreds of Snowy Egrets and Little Blue Herons and thousands of Cattle Egrets in Florida. In my experience, the bill shape of the Snowy Egret is different from the thicker and slightly curved bill of the other two.
Similar species and how eliminated: leg/foot color eliminates Little Blue, Cattle and Great Egret. Also the size was much smaller than a Great Egret.
