General Notes: Weather in NW Iowa was extremely dry throughout the entire reporting period, with NO significant rainfall since mid-July (less than ½ inch total from August through November). All but largest wetlands and lakes dried up by early November. Mudflats provided good migration habitat for shorebirds and gulls; few waterfowl migrating into area at all; warbler migration extended by warm fall weather. Fair-good food supply (weed and wild plant seed) going into winter.
