this bird was with a female Ruddy Dack and at first looked as though it was a large Ruddy Duck with its bill tucked behind its wing as leepor resting. After we approached to within 75 to 100 feet the bird raised its head and began swimming adjacent to us. The bird had a fairly dark heavy, longish bill with about the basal "Is having some lighter yellowish color in it, especially on the lower mendible. The eye was black. The top of the head, back of the head and back of the neck was blackish. The back was a very dark group to black color. The sides were a light gray color when visible above the water line. The breast and front of the neck was a washed out reddish color, not a bright whous color but a dull reddish color. There was a large whitish to light gray patch which started at the base of the bill and ron through the eye and curved around and included the auricular area, the throat and the chin, but not down on to the neck. The neck also appeared rather thick.
Similar species and how eliminated: No other grebe has a large white throat/cheek patch, reddish neck and heavy, long bill.

Viewing conditions: give lighting, distance (how measured), and optical equipment: Sunny, excellent viewing conditions from approx. 50 to 75 at closest using 33x90 telescope and 10x 40 bins culars.
Previous experience with species and similar ones: Have seen several Red-necked Grebes several Eared Grebes, quite a few Western (Clark's type Grebes and lots of Pied-billed and Horned References and persons consulted before writing description: None Grebes.
