Description of bird: The bird was swimming with several Common Goldeneyes and was a larger and stockier bird and had a longer neck. The back, back of neck, crown, and cheek were grayish. The sides and throat were a dull white, lighter than the back. The large head and large bill gave the bird a large-headed appearance. The bill was about as long as the head, quite thick, and dull yellow. The dark cheek had a conspicuous white crescent that angled up from the throat behind the cheek.

Similar species and how eliminated: Western Grebe eliminated by its longer neck, thinner bill, and lack of a white crescent on the cheek.

Viewing conditions and equipment: Viewing conditions were good with the sun mostly behind me. Estimated viewing distance was 150-175 yards. I used a Buschnell 20-45x spotting scope.

Previous experience with species: I saw several Red-necked Grebes last fall at Saylorville and two this spring at Little Wall L.
