The most obvious markings were the red side; and the white front of the neck. Upon closer inspection, the eye was seen to be red, the top of the head dark green, and large ear patches of yellow. The back of the bird, as well as the cheeks—were charcoal gray. The back of the neck was black and the side of the neck was a white line, extending up like that of a Pintail duck. The bird appeared to be tailless; the rear being whitish. It skittered on the water before becoming airborne. It seemed to exhibit whitish "speculum" patches on the wings.
