American Coot 6/10 Cleghorn WA, Howard 13 13 nests were at Cleghorn in the Turkey River floodplain. Many nests were also at Harmon Lake, Winnebago and Myre Slough. Black Tern□6/8 Saylorville, Polk-2 6/10 Cleghorn WA, Howard-11 6/10 Harmon Lake, Winnebago-6 The first two sightings were migrants. The Harmon Lake birds appeared to be nesting, although I can't prove it. Black-billed Cuckoo Yellow-billed Cuckoo Polk many As opposed to Black-billeds, were regularly seen and heard ... Common Nighthawk Johnston, Polk -6 A few more than past few years in Johnston. Ruby-throated Hummingbird Johnston, Polk 32 females and a male at my feeders this summer. Red-headed Woodpecker Eastern Wood-Pewee Another species that seems much less common than 15 years ago. Willow Flycatcher□6/8 Polk City WA, Polk-1 6/10 Cleghorn WA, Howard-1 6/11 Hayden Prairie, Howard-6 6/11 Harmon Lake, Winnebago-1 7/6□ Neal Smith NWR, Jasper Cleghorn WA, Howard-6 As you can tell, pretty common this summer. Sedge Wren Red Feather Prairie, Polk 3-10+Bottomed out at 3 territories in mid-June. Increased to double digits by mid-July. Cedar Waxwing Fairly regular around Saylorville and my yard this summer. Bell's Vireo Red Feather Prairie, Polk My regulars were present in May, but absent this summer. Magnolia Warbler 6/1 Saylorville, Polk 2 Dickcissel Numbers seemed down a little bit in Polk, but still common. Practically absent during my trip to northern Iowa in early June. Eastern Towhee Polk Several around Saylorville. Savannah Sparrow 6/11 Hayden Prairie, Howard Grasshopper Sparrow□Not quite as common in Polk this summer.. Henslow's Sparrow□ Red Feather Prairie, Polk-5 Chichagua, Polk-15+ Neal Smith, Jasper-5 There were times when I had more Henslowis than Grasshopper Sparrows on an outing. One location at Chichaqua had 10 singing birds on a very windy day in a relatively small area of a restored grassland.

Bobolink DVery common on my swing through Howard, Winnebago and Hancock in early June. One the other hand, nearly absent in my usual Polk county spots. Yellow-headed Blackbird 6/10 Cleghorn WA, Howard 20+ Surprised to see that many in NE Iowa. That

Orchard Oriole Saylorville Several around the lake, which is encouraging.
