Dear Mr. Rosen:

Your letter of July 20, concerning the Arkansas kingbird, has been received.

This bird is of not uncommon occurrence in the northwestern part of Iowa and has been noted several times at Wall Iake; and also at Spirit Iake on July 30, 1902. Furthermore, there is a somewhat doubtful record from Boonesboro, but otherwise your record from Ogden seems to be the easternmost one from the State.

Regarding the woodcock, we have no very recent reports of its nesting in Iowa, but possibly it has done so without our having been informed.

In accordance with your request we are forwarding you 100 additional cards for your migration report. We are pleased to note that you expect to have a full report for the coming autumn.
