While in my back yard I heard an unfamiliar bird song. I located the bird in a ash tree moving from spot to spot in rapid warbler fashion. The foliage was very dense but I was able to pick the bird into the open. I had a good frontal view. It was warbler in size, yellow underparts which were heavily streaked in black. The bird came into the open about 4 more times and I observed that the back, head and wings were black. The white eyebrow was prominent with some white on the wings. The bird called approx. once every minute. The bird flew from the back of the tree about ten minutes later. I returned to the house to listen to the Magnolia warbler song tape to further confirm that I had seen a Male adult Magnolia

Similar species; how eliminated:

Eliminated yellow-rumped because of white breast.
Wrong facial coloring for Cape May.

all similar species have very dissimilar song.
