

In NORTHEAST IOWA, THE FIRST BARN OWL REPORT OF THE YEAR - A BIRD SEEN AT SMITH'S SCOURGH, TRUMBULL LAKE IN CLAY COUNTY ON THE 26TH - THE LOCATION THE SAME AS ONE SIGHTED IN OCTOBER OF 1988,

THE ADULT CALIFORNIA GULL, DISCOVERED ON THANKSGIVING DAY AT CREDIT ISLAND IN DAVENPORT WAS SEEN AGAIN ON SATURDAY MORNING THE 25TH AT THE WESTERN TIP OF CREDIT ISLAND, BUT THERE HAVE BEEN NO FURTHER SIGHTINGS. TO LOOK THROUGH THE LARGE NUMBER OF GULLS, DO SO EITHER FROM CREDIT ISLAND PARK OR FROM CARLTON STREET NEAR THE POLLUTION CONTROL PLANT, BOTH THESE AREAS CAN BE REACHED FROM U.S. HIGHWAY 61 IN THE WEST PART OF DAVENPORT. YOU MIGHT TRY CALLING PETE PETERSEN FOR NEWS AT 355-7051. THERE IS ALSO AT LEAST ONE FIRST WINTER THAYER'S GULL PRESENT THERE.

In OTHER SOUTHEAST IOWA news, 2 FIRST WINTER THAYER'S GULLS WERE OBSERVED FROM THE KEOKUK WATERFRONT FEEDING BENIND BANTS GOING THROUGH LOCK & DAM #19. AT HICKORY HILL PARK IN IOWA CITY, A NORTHERN SHRIKE AND SPARROWHAWK OWL ON THE 24TH. AT LACEY KESSELER STATE PARK IN VAN BUREN COUNTY A COMMON LOON ON THE LAKE AND 2 GOLDEN-CROWNED KINGLET, A WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILL AT THE FAIRFIELD CEMETERY AND WOODS IN WASHINGTON COUNTY IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY, A BALD EAGLE AND NORTHERN SHRIKE AT THE 26TH.

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, 2 GOLDEN EAGLES OVER THE UPPER IOWA RIVER BLUFFS NORTH OF COUNTY ROAD A-26, SOUTH-WEST OF NEW ALBAN, 7 WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILLS NEAR THE SAWMILL AT YELLOW RIVER STATE FOREST, AND ON POOL #9 OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER NORTH OF HARPER'S FERRY, 160 TUNDRA SWANS ON THE ICE AND 20 BALD EAGLES AND ONE IMMATURE GOLDEN EAGLE, AND AT EFFACY MOUNTAIN NATIONAL MONUMENT, 2 CAROLINA WRENS, ALL REPORT THEM THE 24TH. ALSO IN NORTHEAST IOWA IN LINN COUNTY,

A WHITE-WINGED SCOTER AND LATE PAIRED SANDPIPER
AT PLEASANT CREEK STATE PARK NORTH OF PAX, 6
WHITE-WINGED CROSSBILLS AT CEDAR MEMORIAL CEMETERY
IN CEDAR RAPIDS ALL ON THE 24TH.

IN SOUTHWEST IOWA, OBSERVED AT PONY CREEK
LAKE WEST OF GLENWOOD AND THE NORTH END OF
THE IAL POWER PLANT SOUTH OF LOWELL BEAVERS, BOTH
AND POTTERWATTAMIE COUNTIES ON THE 25TH.

IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA, A NORTHERN GOLDFINCH
AT THE CAMPING AREA ALONG THE SOUTH SIDE OF
RATHBUN RESERVOIR IN APPALOOSA COUNTY, AND IN
THE SLough BELOW THE DAM AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR, A
BASIC PLUMAGED DUNLIN. AND IN WAYNE COUNTY AN
~~IMMATURE TRUMPETER SWAN~~ PROMISE CITY ON THE 23RD
IN THE STATE
HERE ARE STILL LARGE NUMBERS OF DUCKS AT
KEOKUK AND THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR, AND SOME
GOOD NUMBERS OF OTHER WATERFOWL AT RED ROCK,
RUNNELS, SAYLORVILLE, PRO DESOTO NWR, INCLUDING 2000
COMMON MEGANSES AT SAYLORVILLE

IN NEW REPORTS, FROM THE 26TH, 8 WHITE WINGED
CROSSBILLS AT LISCOMB IN MARSHALL COUNTY AND A HERRIE
FALCON NORTHWEST OF HOBBLERS IN HARVEST COUNTY ON THE
28TH AND IN ^{SOUTHEAST} JOHNSON CO., A WINTER WREN AND
PILEATED WOODPECKER NEAR THE HIGHWAY #22 BRIDGE OVER THE
IOWA RIVER ON THE 29TH.
