OF JANUARY 2ND. IT WAS A GREAT BIRD THAT
BIRDERS FROM MANY PLACES THROUGHOUT THE MIDWEST
^{IN CENTRAL IOWA,}
GOT TO VIEW AT CLOSE RANGE. THE YELLOW GRASBEAK
HAS BEEN VERY IRREGULAR. SOME DAYS IT IS SEEN, AT
THE MOSMAN'S FEEDER, AND OTHERS IT DOES NOT PUT IN
AN APPEARANCE ^{AT ALL.} IT WAS THOUGHT TO BE GONE, AS IT WAS
NOT SEEN FOR ALMOST 3 DAYS, BUT REAPPEARED AT
9:30 PM ON SUNDAY AFTERNOON. THE C. M. DEAN MOSMAN
ADVISES ~~THAT~~ ^{IN HIS DRIVEWAY} THAT THERE IS A SIGN WITH DIRECTIONS
FOR BIRDERS ON IT. PLEASE WATCH THE FEEDERS FROM
THE AREA BEHIND THE PROPANE TANK SOUTH OF THE HOME.
IT IS MOST LIKELY TO BE SEEN FROM 3 PM TO DARK.
DIRECTIONS TO THE MOSMAN'S ARE AS FOLLOWS: FROM
I-35 NORTH OF ANKENY TAKE EXIT 96 AND GO EAST
TO ELKHORN, THEN ANOTHER 2 MILES EAST ~~TO~~ ^{RND} A HALF MILE
SOUTH ^{TO THE HOUSE ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE ROAD} THE PHONE NUMBER OF DEAN AND DIANE
MOSMAN IS (515) 967-2951. THROUGHOUT THE
STATE THERE HAVE BEEN ^{NUMEROUS} FLOCKS OF LAPLAND
LONGSPURS AND SNOW BUNTINGS REPORTED.

IN SOUTH CENTRAL IOWA, A SNOWY OWL HAS BEEN
REGULARLY WITH THE LAST REPORT FROM THE 5TH, GO EAST
FROM CLIO ^{1 1/4 MILE} ON COUNTY ROAD I-54, THEN NORTH ON
GRAVEL ^{1 1/4 MILE}. IT IS MOST OFTEN SEEN SITTING IN A
SOLITARY TREE ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF THE ROAD. AT
RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY, THE FIRST WINTER
BLACK LEGGED KITTIWAKE WAS STILL PRESENT BELOW THE DAM
ON THE 5TH, 20 SNOW BUNTINGS WERE AT THE BEACH OF

WHITEBREAST RECOLLECTION AREA ON THE 4TH, A NORTHERN
GOSHAWK WAS SEEN ALONG THE ROAD TO THE NORTH TAIL-
WATERS AREA ON THE 2ND, AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD WAS
SEEN 200 YARDS WEST OF ^{THE REGISTRATION BOOTH} HOWELL STATION CAMPGROUND ON
THE 1ST.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, THE ^{IN POLK COUNTY} TOWNLAND'S SOLITARE CONTINUES TO
BE SEEN ~~NORTHWEST OF BIG CREEK STATE PARK~~, AT LEAST
THROUGH THE 4TH. TAKE HIGHWAY 415 PAST BIG CREEK
STATE PARK TO NW 146TH AVENUE, THEN EAST ON GRAIN
AND LOOK IN CEDARS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE ROAD
BEFORE THE SMALL BRIDGE. BIG CREEK STATE PARK IS
A GOOD PLACE TO SEE NORTHERN SHRIKES, AND ONE WAS
REPORTED ALONG THE ROAD ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE LAKE ON
THE 1ST AND ANOTHER ALONG 100TH STREET ON THE 2ND. A
NORTHERN GOSHAWK WAS NEAR THE CEMETERY EAST
OF EELKHART ON THE 6TH.

IN SOUTHEAST IOWA, A ^{TRUMPETER} TANAGER WAS STILL
BEING SEEN IN THE IOWA RIVER FROM BELOW THE DAM AT
THE IOWA RIVER POWER COMPANY RESTAURANT IN CORALVILLE TO
DOWNSTREAM TO THE GRAND PARK OFF OF ROCKY
SHORE DRIVE IN IOWA CITY. THE 2 TRUMPETER SWANS
WERE LAST SEEN ON THE 5TH AT THE BUTTER BRIDGE
WHICH CARRIES DUBUQUE STREET OVER THE RIVER JUST
NORTH OF EXIT 244 OF INTERSTATE 80. A ^{ONTHECII} SNOW
YEST OWL WAS FOUND ^{ONTHECII} IN CEDARS CLOSE TO THE NORTH EDGE
OF JOHNSON COUNTY ROAD F-20, .9 MILE WEST OF
THE HAWKEYE WILDLIFE HEADQUARTERS, AND A LONG EARED

OWL WAS IN A LARGE PINE GROUP SOUTH OF COUNTY ROAD F-28, 2 MILES WEST OF I-380 ON THE 2ND ^{WEST OF TOWN}, UP TO 5 SHORT EARED OWLS ARE STILL BEING SEEN LATE IN THE DAY OVER A WEEDY FIELD ^{ON THE SIDE}, NORTH OF JOHNSON COUNTY ROAD F-46, AT A POINT 3 MILES WEST OF THE HIGHWAY 218 MCROSE AVENUE INTERCHANGE AND A FEMALE RED CROSSBILL WAS AT A FEEDER NORTH OF TOWN CITY ON THE 4TH, BUT WAS NOT RETURNED. AT BURLINGTON, THE EURASIAN TREE SPARROWS ARE STILL PRESENT NORTH OF TOWN. AND A WINTER WREN WAS AT CRADDO PARK ON THE 6TH. FOR DIRECTIONS, CALL CHUCK FANNER AT (319) 753-0710.

IN THE NORTHWEST THE VARIED THRUSH WAS STILL AT THE FEEDER OF JIM BOCK, 814 W. 10TH IN SPENCER. AT LEAST THROUGH THE 4TH. YOU CAN CALL JIM FOR UPDATES AT (712) 262-6578. THE SIOUX CITY CHRISTMAS COUNT ON DECEMBER 29TH HAD COMMON SNipe, VIRGINIA RAIL AND A BLACK-BELLIED MAGPIE WHICH WAS A FLYBY NEAR THE FLOYD MONUMENT, AND THE WESTFIELD ^{IN MUNMOUTH CO} COUNT, ON JANUARY 2ND HAD HERMIT THRUSH AND YELLOW RUMBLE WARRIOR.

IN THE SOUTHWEST, 2 MORE RED CROSSBILLS WERE AT AN ATLANTIC FEEDER THROUGH THE 6TH. FOR MORE INFORMATION CALL SHARON STEFFENS AT (712) 243-1835.
