STILL BEING SEEN THROUGH JULY 4<sup>TH</sup>. THE CENTER OF  
THE BIRD'S TERRITORY IS THE FARMYARD OF WILLARD SANDS.

IT IS A BRICK HOME LOCATED ONE-HALF MILE NORTH OF  
CRAWFORDSVILLE ON THE EAST SIDE OF US HIGHWAY #218.
