IN THE NORTH POND
IN SOUTHWEST IOWA, AT THE IPL GENERATING STATION
SOUTH OF COUNCIL BLUFFS ON THE 30TH, ^{A 1ST WINTER TYPICAL GULL} A FEMALE BLACK
SCOTER, 2 HOODED Mergansers, 3 FRANKLIN'S GULLS, AND
17 WATER FOWL SPECIES. IN A POND JUST EAST OF THE
IPL PLANT AND ACROSS I-29, AN IMMATURE CATTLE
EGRET AND 9 BREWER'S BLACKBIRDS AND AT LAKE
MANAWA A WHITE PELICAN

IN A NEW REPORT FROM ROUTE 2ND, A
COMMON BLACK HEADED GULL, AN ADULT IN
WINTER PLUMAGE WAS SEEN FROM THE CHEADY
GLEW AREA OF THE SAVANNAH RESERVOIR.
IT WAS WITH BONAPARTE'S GULLS. THIS WOULD
BE A FIRST STATE RECORD. ALSO AT SAVANNAH
ON THE 2ND 3 WHITE-WINGED SCOTERS. ON SAT
THE 4TH IT WAS SEEN AT MID. ~~HOODED MERN~~
~~THERE WERE NO REPORTS OF THE GULL REPORTED~~
ON FRIDAY THE 3RD, BUT A PRARIE FALCON WAS
SEEN AT THE DAM

ON SAT THE 4TH IT WAS SEEN FOR A HALF
HOUR ABOUT MID-DAY FLYING OVER THE DAM, &
OVER THE POND AND RIVER BELOW THE DAM.
ALSO A PRARIE FALCON ALONG THE DAM ON THE 3RD
HOODED Mergansers, NORTON + WESTERN CRESTS ON
THE 4TH.

IN A NEW REPORT, A FEMALE BLACK SCOTER, A WHITE-
WINGED SCOTER, 5 COMMON LOONS, AND 11 DUCK SPECIES
WERE SEEN TODAY FROM THE WEST OVERLOOK CAMPGROUND
AT THE CONROUVE RESERVOIR.

THIS TIME OF YEAR, THE STATE'S LARGE LAKES AND RES-
ERVOIRS ATTRACT THE BIRDS AND BIRDERS. AND THERE HAVE
BEEN A NUMBER OF GOOD ^{WATERBIRD} SIGHTINGS THIS PAST WEEK.

NORTH OF DES MOINES

AT SAYLORVILLE, ON THE 28TH, SEEN FROM THE DAM,
A POSSIBLE PACIFIC LOON, 2 COMMON LOONS, A HORNED
GREBE, 2 WESTERN GREBES, AND A BLACK SCOTER. FROM
CHERRY GLEN RECREATION AREA A SURF SCOTER AND LATE
FORSTER'S TERN. AT ~~THE~~ OAK GROVE, 13 SNOW BUNTINGS,
WATER PIPITS, AND 12 VERY LATE STILT SANDPIPERS,
AND AT SAND PIPER, 6 DOWITCHERS, AND AT THAT
LOCATION ON THE 27TH 6 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AND
1 BLACK BELLYED PLOVER. AT JESTER PARK, 7 WHITE
PELICANS, AND A TOTAL OF 11 DUCK SPECIES ON THE
LAKE.

AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY, THE
LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL IN FIRST WINTER PLUMAGE
WAS SEEN AGAIN BELOW THE DAM ON THE 27TH; AND
A HORNED GREBE WAS AT THE ROBERTS CREEK AREA
ALONG COUNTY ROAD 6-28.

FARTHER UPSTREAM, AT THE RANNELL'S WILDLIFE AREA,
ON THE 29TH, THERE WERE 3 SPECIES OF GEESE, IN-
CLUDING 24 WHITE FRONTED, 16 ROCK SPECIES, AND
AT THE SECOND POND 6 SHOREBIRD SPECIES INCLUDING
DUNLIN AND LONG BILLED DOWITCHERS, AS WELL AS 3
BALD EAGLES

AND AT RIDGE IN GREENE COUNTY, 4 PINE
SISKINS AT A FEEDER ON THE 28TH.

AND IN NORTHWEST IOWA, MATT KENNER SAW 2
JAEGER, UNIDENTIFIABLE AS TO SPECIES, FLY OVER,
AND SUGGESTS SAYLORVILLE BIRDERS BE ON THE
LOOKOUT THE NEXT FEW DAYS. ALSO, A WHITE
WINGED CROSSBILL HAS BEEN ^{SEEN} IN A WEST SPENCER
BACKYARD SEVERAL TIMES RECENTLY AND A RED CROSSBILL AT A STARK CITY FEEDER
