AT DESOTO NW REEDLE IN HARRISON COUNTY, 2
WESTERN GEEBE WERE PRESENT ON THE 22ND
AND IN NW IOWA AT SMITH'S LAKE 3
MILES NORTH OF ALGONA IN KOSUTH COUNTY
A WESTERN GEEBE THAT WAS FIRST SEEN ON THE
21ST WAS STILL PRESENT ON THE 23RD. ALSO IN
KOSUTH COUNTY GREEN BACKED HERON AT UNION
SLOUGH NW ON THE 19TH + ALGONA'S FIRST
HOUSE FINCHES (BUT ASSURELY NOT THE LAST)
AND AT RUSH LAKE IN MICHONDALE ON THE 26TH BLUE GROSBEAK

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, RAPTOR REPORTS WITH A
PEREGRINE FALCON SOUTH OF NEW ALBIN IN ALLAMAKEE COUNTY ON THE 23RD, 2 SWAINSON'S HAWKS
AT GEORGE WYATT PARK NEAR WATERLOO AND
2 RED SHOULDERED HAWKS AT THE SOUTH SIDE OF
SWEET MARSH IN BREMER COUNTY

on Today, April 29 01 AM a Tropicored
Lemon was discovered near the end of
the E-W dike at Cone Marsh in Lassen
County. However it flew, and after
searching most of the afternoon could not
~~be~~ relocate. If kept by
marks soon it would be a first state
record. To look go south from Lone
Tree on County X-14 6.8 miles from R
shool Run when ~~X-14~~ ^{too} goes east
at a right angle continue south on gravel
1 mile then go east on the river
bank opposite a valley house. At end of
bank walk on ^{ext} the dike. Also
present was a small Common Seal -
of the S road in the most W
unit. A possibly burrowing
hawk just S of the marsh + very
rare, saw it along the dike + a
common moorhen or a least sed
of man.
