MAKES A RIGHT ANGLE TURN TO THE EAST. YOU
CONTINUE SOUTH ON GRAVEL 1 MILE AND TURN
EAST DOWN A LANE OPPOSITE A YELLOW HOUSE. AT
THE END OF THE LANE, WALK EAST ON THE DIKE
PAST WHERE WATER IS GOING UNDER THE
DIKE AND LOOK TO THE NORTH. THERE ARE
ALSO MANY WATERFOWL INCLUDING 25 WHITE
FRONTED GEESE AND NUMEROUS SWIFTS ON THE
MARSH. AND TUNDRA SWANS ON THE MISSISSIPPI
RIVER IN THE ENCHANTED ISLAND AREA NEAR
THE WEST CITY LIMITS OF DODGEPORT

~~BEST BIRDS OF THE WEEK ARE SCATTERED HUNDREDS SMITH'S LONGSPURS IN SOUTHWEST IOWA.~~ ON BOTH THE 1ST + 2ND SEVERAL HUNDRED SMITH'S LONGSPURS WERE PRESENT IN LEWIS COUNTY NEAR COVE MARSH. THE EXACT LOCATION IS ^{IN A FIELD} SOUTH OF THE SOUTH COVE MARSH ROAD APPROXIMATELY 1 3/4 MILES WEST OF CONESVILLE. TO SEE THE BIRDS YOU MAY HAVE TO WALK INTO THE FIELD SEVERAL HUNDRED YARDS.

ALSO IN SE IOWA AT THE CORACOME RESERVOIR IN JOHNSON COUNTY, LONG-EARED AND SWAN WHET OWLS, WATER PIPITS IN A WINTER WHEAT FIELD ALONG THE BOB-COCK LAKE ROAD, A LATE BIRD EAGLE, AND A NUMBER OF YELLOWLEGS, ALL SEEN ON THE 1ST. AT FARMFIELD IN JEFFERSON COUNTY ON THE 1ST + 2ND LOGGERHEAD SHRIKE PURPLE MARTINS, RUDDY DUCK, FIELD SPARROWS AND HERMIT THRUSH. AND IN LEE COUNTY, NESTING E. PHOEBE'S & TOWHEES FIELD SPARROW AND SPOTTED AND AT LACEY-KEE AUGUST 5TH IN VAN BUREN COUNTY A LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH ON THE FIRST

In SW IOWA, AN UNUSUAL MOSTLY WHITE ROBIN AT GLENWOOD IN MILLS COUNTY, WHICH HANGS OUT AROUND THE CORNER OF 3RD + WALNUT, 1 BLOCK EAST OF HIGHWAY 275 IN THE YARD OF A BIG YELLOW HOUSE, WHICH IS BEHIND A DENTIST'S OFFICE.
