IN NEW REPORTS A PAIR OF CINNAMON TEAL WERE
SEEN IN SOUTHEAST ~~Town~~ AT ~~LONG~~ MARSH IN
LOUISA COUNTY ^{BOTH APRIL 6TH + 7TH} ^{AT THE School} TO LOOK FOR THESE BIRDS IN
THE TOWN OF LONE TREE CONTINUE SOUTH ON
COUNTY BLACKETOP 6 MILES TO WHERE X-14
MAKES A RIGHT ANGLE TURN TO THE EAST. YOU
CONTINUE SOUTH ON GRAVEL 1 MILE AND TURN
EAST DOWN A LANE OPPOSITE A YELLOW HOUSE. AT
THE END OF THE LANE, WALK EAST ON THE DIKE
PAST WHERE WATER IS GOING UNDER THE
DIKE AND LOOK TO THE NORTH. THERE ARE
ALSO MANY WATERFOWL INCLUDING 25 WHITE
FRONTED GEESE AND NUMEROUS SNIFE ON THE
MARSH. AND TUNDRA SWANS ON THE MISSISSIPPI
RIVER IN THE ENCHANTED ISLAND AREA NEAR
THE WEST CITY LIMITS OF DRAVENPORT

PROXIMATELY 1³/₄ MILES WEST OF CONESVILLE. TO SEE
THE BIRDS YOU MAY HAVE TO WALK INTO THE FIELD
SEVERAL HUNDRED YARDS.
