

* IN NORTHEAST MADISON COUNTY A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD AND UPLAND SANDPIPER WERE SPOTTED ON THE 21ST.

THE CONTINUED EAST WINDS AND WET WEATHER HAVE
HAVE RECENTLY SLOWED THE MIGRATION. HOWEVER, SEVERAL
BIRDS WERE REPORTED FOR THIS SPRING THE FIRST TIME IN THE PAST FEW
DAYS, NO BANK SWALLOW, INCLUDED, A GREAT CRESTED FLYCATCHER, UNNAMED
SANDPIPER, NIGHTINGALE, HOUSE WREN, SPOTTED SANDPIPER,
EASTERN KINGBIRD, WHIPPOORWILL, AND LARK SPARROW.
HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF
GREAT TAILED GRACKLE; OUTSTANDING
EARED GREBE; AND CINNAMON TEAL IN THE CENTRAL AND
BEWICK'S WREN IN THE SOUTHEAST. AND WE HAVE HAD NO
NEWS THIS WEEK ABOUT THE BLACK NECKED STILT AND
ROCK WREN, IN WOODBURY COUNTY OR THE BARRELSWELL SWAMP
KOLUTH COUNTY.

AT LAKIN SLOCUM IN NORTHEAST GUTHRIE COUNTY, 3
GREAT TAILED GRACKLES WERE FOUND ON THE 18TH. AT THE
LOLO PARKS IN STORY COUNTY, THE DRAKE CINNAMON TEAL, FIRST REPORTED
THE 13TH, WAS STILL BEING SEEN ON THE 21ST. - 6013.60
MILES EAST OF LOLO ON OLD HIGHWAY 30 AND THEN NORTH
ON GRAVEL A HALF MILE AND LOOK ON THE EAST SIDE OF
THE ROAD. AT DOOLITTLE PRairie, AN AMERICAN BITTERN
AND 2 SWANS ON THE 21ST AT LITTLE MARSH LAKE IN
HAMILTON COUNTY, ON THE 20TH AND 21ST, 2
COMMON LOONS, 2 EARED GREBES, 6 HORNET GREBES, AND
A FEMALE OLDSQUAW, AND ON THE 17TH 4 BLACK
CRESTED NIGHT HERONS. A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS IN
MARSHALL COUNTY ON THE 20TH, THERE WERE A LARGE
NUMBER OF PINE SISKINS STILL IN GLENDALE CEMETERY
IN DES MOINES ON THE 21ST. * AND THE GREAT BLUE
HERON ROOKERY IN HARVEST COUNTY HAS GROWN TO

11 NESTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION, AND CAN BE VIEWED BY GOING WEST OF AMOS ABOUT 3 MILES, ON COUNTY ROAD D-65, THEN USE A FARM DUMPLER ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE ROAD AT THE TOP OF A HILL. IN

ON THE 21ST,

IN THE SOUTHEAST A PAIR OF BEWICK'S CUCKOOS WAS LOCATED AT A TANKYARD IN LEE COUNTY, WHERE THEY WERE PRESENT LAST SPRING. FROM THE TOWN OF ARGYLE GO WEST ON GRAVEL 2 MILES TO A Y WHERE YOU TAKE THE RIGHT FORK AND WILL ENCOUNTER THE TANKYARDS IN LESS THAN A MILE. AT LACEY KEOGAHUA STATE PARK IN VAN BUREN COUNTY, YELLOW THROATED AND PALM WARBLERS, LOUISIANA WATER THRUSHES, AND GREAT CRESTED FlyCATCHERS WINTER HERE, ALSO SPOTTED MONARCHS AT THE 8TH ROAD AREA ON THE 21ST, AND NEAR THESE OPLAND LAKES. A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS SEEN AT THE CALDWELL RESERVOIR, IN JACKSON COUNTY, ON THE 21ST ~~along~~ ^{along} THE SWAN LAKE ROAD A QUARTER MILE ~~south~~ ^{and} OF THE DUPONT BRIDGE ROAD^{and} A COMMON MOURNING WAS SEEN FROM MEADOWS AT SWAN LAKE ROAD IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, A GRIFFON SCOPS HAS BEEN ON A FARM POND SINCE APRIL 17TH AT LEAST THROUGH THE 21ST. THE POND IS REACHED FROM THE WEST EDGE OF FAIRFIELD BY GOING SOUTH ON COUNTY ROAD H-33 0.7 MILE - #

AT GREEN ISLANDS WILDLIFE AREA IN JACKSON
COUNTY, 10 SANDHILL CRANES WERE SEEN ON
THE 18TH; CRANES WERE ^{HEARD BUT} NOT SEEN ON THE 21ST.
ALSO PRESENT WERE 2 NORTHERN GEESES, AN EASTERN
LILAC BIRD, AND AN ACTIVE BALD EAGLE NEST.
