

* IN NORTHEAST MADISON COUNTY A NORTHEAST
MOCKINGBIRD AND UPLAND SANDPIPER WERE SPOTTED
ON THE 21ST.

THE CONTINUED EAST WINDS AND WET WEATHER HAVE
HAVE REALLY SLOWED THEIR MIGRATION. HOWEVER, SEVERAL
BIRDS WERE REPORTED ^{FOR} THE FIRST TIME ^{THIS SPRING} IN THE PAST FEW
DAYS ^{AND} INCLUDING ^{BANK SWALLOW} GREAT CRESTED FLYCATCHER, UPLAND
SANDPIPER, NIGHTHAWK, HOUSE WREN, SPOTTED SANDPIPER,
EASTERN KINGBIRD, WHIPOORWILL, AND LARK SPARROW.
HIGHLIGHTS INCLUDE ^{THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF} GREAT TAILED GRACKLE; OLD SQUAW,
EARED GREBE; AND CINNAMON TEAL IN THE CENTRAL, AND
BEWICK'S WREN IN THE SOUTHWEST. AND ^{FROM THE NORTHWEST} WE HAVE HAD NO
NEWS THIS WEEK ABOUT THE BLACK NECKED STILT AND
ROCK WREN ^{THAT WERE} IN WOODBURY COUNTY OR THE BURROWING OWL IN
KOSUTH COUNTY.

AT LAKIN CLOUGH IN NORTHEAST LUTHERIE COUNTY, 3
GREAT TAILED GRACKLES WERE FOUND ON THE 18TH. AT THE
LOLO POND IN STORY COUNTY, THE DRAKE CINNAMON TEAL, FIRST REPORTED
THE 13TH, WAS STILL BEING SEEN ON THE 21ST, - 60013 TWO
MILES EAST OF LOLO ON OLD HIGHWAY 30 AND THEN NORTH
ON GRAVEL A HALF MILE AND LOOK ON THE EAST SIDE OF
THE ROAD. AT DOOLITTLE PRAIRIE, AN AMERICAN BITTERN
AND 2 SURAS ON THE 21ST AT LITTLE WALK LAKE IN
HAMILTON COUNTY ON THE 20TH AND 21ST 2
COMMON LOON, 2 EARED GREBS, 6 HORSED GREBS, AND
A FEMALE OLD SQUAW, AND ON THE 17TH 4 BLACK
CRESTED NIGHT HERONS. A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS IN
MARSHALL COUNTY ON THE 20TH, THERE WERE A LARGE
NUMBER OF PINE SISKINS STILL IN GLENDALE CEMETERY
IN DES MOINES ON THE 21ST. * AND THE GREAT BLUE
NECK ROOKERY IN WERRON COUNTY HAS GROWN TO

11 NESTS UNDER CONSTRUCTION, AND CAN BE VIEWED BY GOING WEST OF UNION ABOUT 3 MILES, ON COUNTY ROAD D-65, THEN USE A FARM DULLOCK ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE ROAD AT THE TOP OF A HILL. IN

ON THE 21ST,
IN THE SOUTHEAST, A PAIR OF BELWICK'S CURLEWS WAS LOCATED AT A JUNKYARD IN LEE COUNTY, WHERE THEY WERE PRESENT LAST SPRING. FROM THE TOWN OF PRUCE GO WEST ON GRAVEL 2 MILES TO A Y WHERE YOU TAKE THE RIGHT FORK AND WILL ENCOUNTER THE JUNKYARD IN LESS THAN A MILE. AT LACEY KEOSAUQUA STATE PARK IN VAN BUREN COUNTY, YELLOW THROATED AND PARULA WARBLERS, LOUISIANA WATER TROUSERS, WINTER WREN, ~~AND SPOTTED SANDPIPER~~, ^{AND GREAT CRISTED TRENCH} AT THE BY FORD AREA ON THE 21ST, AND NEAR THERE OPLAND SANDPIPER. A PEREGRINE FALCON WAS SEEN AT THE CARROLLVILLE RESERVOIR, ^{IN JEFFERSON COUNTY} ON THE 21ST ^{ALONG} ~~WEST~~ OF THE SWAN LAKE ROAD A QUARTER MILE ^{AND A COMMON} ^{WADSWORTH WAS SEEN FROM THE ALLCOTT AT SWAN LAKE} BRIDLE ROAD AND IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, A GREATERN SCAMP HAS BEEN ON A FARM POND ~~STATE~~ FROM THE 17TH AT LEAST THROUGH THE 21ST. THE POND IS REACHED FROM THE WEST EDGE OF FAIRFELD BY GOING SOUTH ON COUNTY ROAD H-33 0.7 MILE. #

IN THE SOUTHWEST ON THE 17TH AND 18TH, IN FREMONT COUNTY, A PEREGRINE FALCON NEAR NEBRASKA CITY, AND AT THE RIVERTON, ^{WILDLIFE} AREA AMERICAN BITTERN, 14 LONG BILLED DOVITERS, AND BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERONS, AND 150 WHITE

FRONTED GEESE. ^{AND} IN ADAMS COUNTY A FLOCK OF
200 CEDAR GOLDEN PLOVER. ALSO RAPTORS SEEMED
TO BE MOVING IN THAT PART OF THE STATE WITH
NUMBERS OF HARRIERS, COOPER'S, BROADWING,
RED TAILS, KESTRELS AND A SWAINSON'S HAWK

IN NORTHEAST IOWA AT GOOSE LAKE WILDLIFE
AREA. IN CLINTON COUNTY, AMERICAN BITTERN,
YELLOW HEADED BLACKBIRD, AND SCRAPE ON THE 21ST.
AT GREEN ISLAND WILDLIFE AREA IN JACKSON
COUNTY, 10 SANDHILL CROWNS WERE SEEN ON
THE 18TH; CROWNS WERE ^{HEARD BUT} NOT SEEN ON THE 21ST.
ALSO PRESENT WERE 2 HORNED GREBS, AN ENTEN,
KING BIRD, AND AN ACTIVE BALD EAGLE NEST
