

ON Monday AFTERNOON June 5 a ^{SAB} ADULT MISSISSIPPI KITE WAS DISCOVERED SITTING ON A SNAG NEAR DUDGEON LAKE ^{PREP} NORTH OF VINTON IN BENTON COUNTY. TO LOOK FOR THE BIRD, GO NORTH OF VINTON ON HIGHWAY 150, CROSS THE CEDAR RIVER, ^{JUST BEFORE ANOTHER BR} AND PARK IN A PARKING LOT ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE ROAD NEAR A LARGE POWER LINE. WALK WEST ALONG THE POWER LINE CUT ~~AND~~ PAST THE UTA POWER POLE AND THERE SHOULD BE A POND ON THE NORTH SIDE. THE BIRD SITS ON THE DEAD SNAG NEAR THE POND ^{OR FLYING} ~~THE~~ ~~AREA~~. DO NOT TRAMP AROUND THIS AREA AS THERE IS AN ACTIVE RED SHOULDERED HAWK NEST IN THE AREA. ~~THERE HAVE BEEN~~ MISS. KITE IS CONSIDERED EXTIRPATED FROM THE STATE AND THERE HAVE BEEN FEW IF ANY MODERN RECORDS FOR THIS BIRD.

IN SOUTHEAST IOWA AT THE CROTON UNIT OF SHIMEN STATE FOREST IN LEE COUNTY NW OF ARCADE, A WORM EATING WARBLER AND THE OTHER REGULARS KENTUCKY, CERULEAN, PARULA, BLUE-WINGED WARBLERS, WHITE-EYED VIREO & CHIT. ALL ON THE 3RD. AND IN WASHINGTON CO. S. OF WASHINGTON SUMMER TANGERS AROUND THE HOME OF BILL PENN. TO SEE THESE BIRDS, CALL BILL AT (319) 653-2049
