ON COUNTY E-16 AT CENTRAL CITY AND THEN TURN RIGHT AT  
RIVER STREET WHICH IS JUST BEFORE THE WARD AVENUE  
RIVER BRIDGE. PARK IN FRONT OF THE 2ND HOUSE ON THE  
RIGHT, 65 RIVER & WATCH THE THISTLE FEEDER  
400 CAN CALL DAVIS AT (319) 938-4433. I WILL ALSO A BLUEBIRD  
ON THE 7TH.
