

OF THE PAST WEEK

THE WINDY AND WET WEATHER HAS SLOWED THE ARRIVAL OF NEW MIGRANTS. TOP BIRDS REPORTED ARE ROCK WREN, BLACKNECKED STILT + BURROWING OWL IN THE NORTHWEST AND CINNAMON TEAL <sup>EARLY MARCH AND ONWARD</sup> IN THE CENTRAL.

THE BLACK NECKED STILT IN WOODBURY COUNTY WAS STILL BEING FOUND ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup>. TO LOOK FOR THIS BIRD FROM THE SALIX EXIT OF I-29 GO WEST AND FOLLOW THE SIGNS TO SNYDER'S BEND COUNTY PARK. WHEN YOU REACH THE PARK, DRIVE TO THE FAR OR EAST END OF THE PARKING LOT. YOU CAN EITHER WALK THE DIRT TRAIL THROUGH THE TREES OR ALONG THE SHORELINE OF THE OXBOW FOR NEARLY A HALF MILE. THE STILT HAS BEEN ACROSS THE OXBOW IN THE AREA WHERE THERE IS AN OPENING IN THE CATTAILS AS WELL AS A SMALL MUD AREA. FOR UPDATES, CALL BILL HUSER AT (402) 494-1657. ALSO PRESENT THESE ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup> WERE MARBLED GODWIT, SANDERLING AND FORSTER'S TERP. ALSO IN WOODBURY COUNTY, A ROCK WREN WAS SEEN ON THE 9<sup>TH</sup>, BUT HAS NOT BEEN RE-LOCATED. IT WAS AROUND RAILROAD TIES AT THE EDGE OF A PARKING LOT, WHICH IS BETWEEN THE SIOUX CITY PLAZA AND A BRIAR LIFE COLLEGE DORMITORY. IN KOSUTH COUNTY, A BURROWING OWL HAS BEEN SEEN ENTERING A BURROW EVERY DAY SINCE THE 16<sup>TH</sup>. However, THE FARMER APPARENTLY DOES NOT WANT BIRDERS AT THIS TIME, BUT MAY FEEL DIFFERENTLY IN A MONTH. WE WILL KEEP YOU POSTED. ALSO IN KOSHUTH COUNTY, A SWAINSON'S HAWK WAS SEEN SOUTHEAST OF ALBONA ON THE 9<sup>TH</sup> AND THERE ARE STILL

IN THE CENTRAL, <sup>IN AM<sup>PAK</sup> COMMON TEAL WAS PRESENT BOTH THE 13<sup>TH</sup> AND 14<sup>TH</sup> IN ONE OF THE COLO PONDS WHICH IS 3 MILES EAST OF COLO ON OLD HIGHWAY 30 THEN NORTH 1/2 TO 3/4 MILES AND LOOK ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE ROAD. TWO LONG BILLED DOWITCHERS HAVE ALSO BEEN AT THE COLO POND. AT LITTLE WREN LAKE IN HAMILTON COUNTY, THERE WERE 3 EARED GEESE AND AN OLD SCARF ON THE 10<sup>TH</sup>. AT THE LEDGE STATE PARK IN BOONE COUNTY, 3 LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSHES AND A CAROLINA WREN WERE SPOTTED ON THE 13<sup>TH</sup>.</sup>

IN SOUTHEAST TOWN, AT LACEY KLOSSNER STATE PARK, ~~THE~~ LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH, 6 YELLOW THROATED WARBLERS, 3 PARULA WARBLERS AND A BROAD WINGED HAWK WERE NOTED AT THE ECY FORD AREA ON THE 12<sup>TH</sup>. AT BURLINGTON, AN EARLY CHIMNEY SWIFT AND A PEREGRINE FALCON WERE NORTH OF TOWN ON THE 12<sup>TH</sup> AND AT GILLIGAN QUARRY SOUTH OF BURLINGTON, COMMON LOON, OSPREY AND WILLET ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>. AT CONE MARSH IN LOUISA COUNTY, A BLACK CROWNED NIGHT HERON ALONG THE SMALL SOUTH DIKE, 100+ 50 LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER AND 2 FOSTER'S TERNS ON THE EAST SIDE ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>. IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, THE ROLLING GOOSE WAS STILL AT SWAN LAKE ON THE ~~14<sup>TH</sup>~~, A MERLIN WAS AT MACBRIDE NATURE AREA, AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD WAS AT THE WEST OVERLOOK CAMPGROUND OF THE CORALVILLE RESERVOIR ALL ON THE 14<sup>TH</sup>.
