IN A NEW, SIGHTING, AN ADULT SCISSOR-TAILED FLYCATCHER WAS IDENTIFIED ON THURSDAY THE 29<sup>TH</sup>, AND REPORTEDLY HAS BEEN PRESENT AT THE LOCATION SINCE MID-MAY. THE BIRD IS LOCATED IN WASHINGTON COUNTY IN AND AROUND THE FARM YARD WHICH IS 1/2 MILE NORTH OF CROWFORESTVILLE ON THE EAST SIDE OF US HIGHWAY #218. THE FARMHOUSE IS BRICK AND THE NAME ON THE MAILBOX IS WILLARD SANDS.

\* IN LOUISA COUNTY AT THE MOUTH OF THE TOLAT RIVER NE OF OAKVILLE, VEERY AND CAROLINA WREN IN THE WOODS SOUTH OF THE LITTLE PARK AND YELLOW CROWNED NIGHT HERON ALONG THE TOLAT RIVER ON THE 24<sup>TH</sup>.

In Central Town, AT LAKIN Slough in NE Butteville Country 5 GREAT-TAILED GRACKLE WERE SEEN IN THE NORTH END OF THE MARSH, AND BLACK-CROWNED NIGHT HERONS WERE ALSO PRESENT ON THE 23<sup>RD</sup>. AND IN POLK County just east of Des Moines, THE WESTERN KINGBIRDS WERE STILL BEING OBSERVED .1 MILE NORTH OF NINETY #163 WHERE 76TH ST NE INTERSECTS 12<sup>TH</sup> AVE NE.

THE GODWIT WAS PRESENT WITH 3 WILLETS ON THE</sup> EARLIER IN THE WEEK. AT THE CROTON UNIT OF 27<sup>TH</sup> SINGER STATE FOREST IN LEE County water EATING WARBLERS FEEDING YOUNG ON THE 24<sup>TH</sup> AND NEAR LACEY-KEARNS AREA STATE PARK <sup>IN UPN BUREAU COUNTY</sup> NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD, BELL'S VIREO, AND UPLAND SANDPIPER ON THE 24<sup>TH</sup>. In South Central Town ONE REPORTER SEARCHED FOR HENRY'S SPARROWS AT A RING GOLD COUNTY CONSERVATION AREA NORTHEAST OF LENOREN WITH NO SUCCESS, BUT DID REPORT GOOD NUMBERS OF NORTHERN

MOCKINGBIRDS, LOGGERSHEADS, SPARROWS, AND UPLAND SANDPIERS IN RINGOLD COUNTY. AND UPLAND SANDPIERS WERE SEEN ALONG HIGHWAY 34 IN CLARKE COUNTY, 1 MILE WEST OF THE LUCAS COUNTY LINE.

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, THE SWAINSON'S HAWKS ARE NESTING IN THE CEDAR FALLS-WATERLOO AREA FOR AT LEAST THE 12TH STRAIGHT YEAR. THEY CAN SOMETIMES BE SEEN HUNTING NEAR THE WATERLOO AIRPORT.
