OCTOBER 22 AT SAYLORVILLE LAKE IN POLK COUNTY.
AND WAS SEEN AGAIN TODAY THE 23RD.
IT WAS WITH A COMMON LOON IN THE MIDDLE OF THE
LAKE BETWEEN THE DAM AND CHERRY CLEW, ALSO
AT SAYLORVILLE ON THE 24TH, 2 WESTERN GEEBES AND
AS WELL AS A LESSER BLACK BACKED GULL.
MANY WATER NIGHTS AT OAK GROVE BEACH, GREATER IN THE
WEEK 3 SURF SCOTERS WERE SEEN THERE. X

LOONS IN THE BACK BAY OF THE SOUTH OVERLAKE,
BUT NO FURTHER REPORTS ON THE LESSER BLACK
BACKED GULL, OR IT REPORTED BELOW THE DAM ON THE
15TH. FOUR PINE SISKINS AT A FEEDER IN RIDGEY
ON THE 22ND.

POOL #19 NEAR MONTROSE.
ABOVE LOCK AND DAM #18 NORTH OF
BURLINGTON, 2 HORNED GEEBES, AND BLACK-BELLIED

PLOVER + SANDERLING ON THE 20TH. AT ASPEL
GROVE CEMETERY IN BURLINGTON, SEVEN RED-
BREASTED NUTHATCHES ON THE 22ND.

OR SPOTTED RACE OF THE RAINFOREST TOWHEE +

AT RED ROCK, THE LESSER BLACK-BELLIED WERE IN THEIR
WINTER PLUMAGE WAS STILL PRESENT BELOW THE DAM AND ALSO
COUNTY ROAD G-28 AND THE RIBBONS CREEK COOP PARK A HORNED GREB
