

THE HIGHLIGHTS ARE THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF 2 SNOWY OWLS IN THE SOUTH AND CENTRAL PORTS OF THE STATE, AND THE YELLOW GROSBEAK HAS NOT BEEN SEEN FOR 6 DAYS.

IN POLK COUNTY

IN THE CENTRAL PART OF THE STATE, THE YELLOW GROSBEAK WAS LAST SEEN ON MONDAY THE 7TH. DEAN NELSON ASSURES US HE WILL KEEP US INFORMED IF IT SHOULDS RETURN. ALSO IN POLK COUNTY, A NORTHERN GOSHAWK WAS SIGHTED AT THE WEST END OF THE MILE LONG BRIDGE OVER THE SAVYORVILLE RESERVOIR ON THE 12TH. IN STORY COUNTY, THE SNOWY OWL WAS AGAIN SEEN AT 5PM ON THE 12TH 3 MILES ~~EAST~~ OR COLO ^{HAS BEEN DISPACETED TO GROO} BETWEEN BLOWING NEW HIGHWAY 30 AND COUNTY ROAD E-41 JUST S OF PT TOWN. ON THE 11TH, A PRAIRIE FALCON WAS SPOTTED ABOUT 2 MILES NORTH OF THAT LOCATION. FOR UPDATES ON THE ONLY CALL NARKE ZOLATEK AT (515) 377-2889 WE HAVE NO REPORTS SINCE THIS WEEK ABOUT THE TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRS NEAR BIG CREEK STATE PARK. IN THE EXTREME SOUTH IN WAYNE COUNTY THE SNOWY OWL FIRST REPORTED DECEMBER 27TH IS MUCH EASIER TO FIND WHICH IS USUALLY SEEN IN THE FIRST HALF MILE, MOST OFTEN IN A SOLITARY TREE ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF THE ROAD. ON THE 13TH IT WAS SITTING IN THE FIELD TO THE LEFT OF THE GRAVEL ROAD ONLY A COUPLE HUNDRED YARDS FROM HOMES IN NORTHEAST CLIO. THESE ARE SHORT EARED OWLS, IN THAT AREA AND ON THE 13TH A PRAIRIE FALCON WAS SEEN ABOUT 3/4 MILE NORTH OF J-54. AS A LARGER HEAD SHRIKE WAS ALONE NEARLY 65 NEAR

MICE MARKER 16, ON THE 13TH

In Southeast Iowa, the 2 Trumpeter Swans were seen again on the 12th just downstream from the Butter Bridge, which crosses the Iowa River just north of Exit 244 of I-80. An adult male White Winged Scoter was below Lock and Dam 15 in downtown Davenport, and an estimated 200 Bald Eagles were in the vicinity of Lock & Dam 14 on the 12th. A report of a Gray Jay at a Main Avenue feeder on the 8th turned out to be a Northern Mockingbird. Florence Scyders reported a Fox Sparrow at her feeder on the 10th and Barbara Beumont who lives just south of North Liberty has a Rufous-sided Towhee at her feeder ^{on the 12th} and near Fairfield, Diane Porter reports ^{several} Eastern Bluebirds, Rough-legged Hawks, and Northern Harriers.

In Southwest Iowa, 3 Red Crossbills were seen at an Atlantic Feeder on the 13th for updates call Donna Rognak at (712) 243-4687 X

In the Northeast, a Pileated Woodpecker was seen near the feeding station in Palisades Kettle State Park in Linn County on the 13th. X
