

In new records, first from Southwest Iowa, in Fremont County, A SWIFT SCAST ON IOWA SIDE OF MISSOURI RIVER EAST OF NEBRASKA CITY; 12 ANGELS FLYING SW OF KARNEY LAKE, A SUMMERTIME TANAGER AT WYOBASIE II AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD NE OF RIVERTON. AT THE IOL GENERATING STATION, IN POTAWATOMIE COUNTY RIDING PLOVER, SANDPIPER, AND LEAST TERN - ALL BIRDS ON THE 13TH. KARNEY LAKE, RIVERTON WILDLIFE AREA AND WILLOW SLOCUM IN MILLS COUNTY ARE AS DRY.

In northwest line at Union Slough NW in Webster County, an estimated 1800 SHOREBIRDS OF 12 SPECIES, INCLUDING MOSTLY PECTORALS AND PEPPERS, BUT ALSO SEEN WERE SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHER, STILT SANDPIPER AND LESSER GOLDEN PLOVER. ALL ON THE 14TH. BEST VIEWING IS IN THE SOUTH END.

THE PASSENGERS ARE STARTING TO MIGRATE AS EVIDENCED IN CENTRAL IOWA AT GRAMMER LEAVES PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, AN OLIVE SIDED FLYCATCHER ON THE 14TH AND BLACKBURNIAN, BLACK + WHITE AND CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLERS ON THE 15TH.

WE HAVE HAD NO NEW INFORMATION ABOUT TWO
GOOD BIRDS ^{IN SE TOWNS} FROM LAST WEEK. THE SCISSOR-TAILED
FLYCATCHER WAS LAST REPORTED ON AUGUST 6TH AT
A FARM ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF WASHINGTON
COUNTY ROAD 6-52, ABOUT 2 1/2 MILES EAST OF
HIGHWAY 218. AND THE WESTERN PEWEE, ^{WHICH WAS} SEEN ON
AUGUST 10TH ON NARROW ISLANDS ~~(LOUISIANA COUNTY)~~
IN THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER BELOW OAKVILLE IN
LOUISIANA COUNTY. YOU NEED A BOAT TO SEARCH FOR
THIS BIRD, AND IF INTERESTED CALL PETE
PETERSEN AT (319) 355-7051. ALSO IN THAT AREA,
A BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER WAS IN A FARMLOT
SOUTH OF OAKVILLE ABOUT 8 MILES ON THE 11TH.
TO REACH THIS FARMLOT GO SOUTH OF KINGSTON
ON HIGHWAY 99 ABOUT A MILE, GO EAST ON A
GRAVEL ROAD ABOUT 2 MILES, AND TURN NORTH BY
A GREEN HOUSE. THEN LOOK IN THE FIELD TO
THE WEST.

ALSO IN SE TOWNS, AT LACEY KEEPSAKE STATE
PARK IN VAN BUREN COUNTY ON THE 11TH, ALDER FLY-
CATCHER, CAROLINA WREN, LOUISIANA WATERTHRUSH AND KEYSTONE
WREN. AT THE STONE BRIDGE NEAR ELY FORD IN
DELMONERS COUNTY 10 MILES NORTH OF BURLINGTON
A JUVENILE LITTLE BLUE HERON ON THE 9TH. AND AT
^{DUPONT BRIDGE AREA} THE CORNWALL RESERVOIR SHOREBIRDS INCLUDING 3 STILT
SANDPIPER AND 6 SHORT BILLED POUCHTERS ON THE 12TH.

AND THE BIRDS ARE STILL SINGING ALONG THE OLD
ROCK ISLAND RAILROAD EMBANKMENT NORTH OF FAIRFIELD IN
JEFFERSON COUNTY

IN CENTRAL TOWNS, NEAR NORWALK, A WESTERN
KINGBIRD AND BLACKBURNIAN WARBLER IN BOB
JOHNSON'S YARD. AT THE LAVENDER WILDLIFE
AREA SE OF RANNEY, 15 SPECIES OF SHOREBIRDS
ON THE 13TH, INCLUDING WESTERN SANDPIPER, DUNLIN,
WILSON'S PHALAROPE, AND BOTH DOWITCHERS. AND
AT ROBERT'S CREEK PARK IN MARION COUNTY A
FEW SHOREBIRDS ON THE 13TH, INCLUDING SHORT-BILLED
DOWITCHER. THESE SANDPIPER CRANES IN MARION
COUNTY WERE SEEN ON THE 11TH. THEY HAVE
BEEN PRESENT FOR SEVERAL MONTHS AT A SMALL
LAKE IN THE KNOXVILLE ESTATES DEVELOPMENT
EAST OF KNOXVILLE ALONG OLD HIGHWAY 92. FOR UP-
DATES CALL ROBERT OR TIMMY TUESDAY AFTER 4:30PM
AT (515) 828-8708. AT THE BRENTON FEEDLOT ON THE POLK-DEWITT
COUNTY LINE, BUFF BREASTED SANDPIPER AND LONGSPURS ON THE 12TH.
THIS AREA IS REACHED BY GOING FROM GRANBY ROAD A MILE TO THE EAST
TO WHERE THERE IS A LARGE FEEDLOT WITH 55 BAILS.
THE BIRDLINE HAD A SINGLE PINE SPARROW AT THE
FEEDER ON THE 11TH.

AND THE 4 PEREGLINE FALCONS RELEASED IN
GEORGE RAPIDS, ARE ALL ALIVE AND FLYING, AND
6 MORE BIRDS WERE PLACED IN THE HACK BOX ATOP
