IN SOUTHWEST IOWA ON THE 28<sup>TH</sup> AT THE IOWA POWER & LIGHT CO. PLANT SOUTH OF COUNCIL BLUFFS IN MILLS COUNTY, 4 LEAST TERNS AND A PIPING PLOVER AND ABOUT A HALF MILE NE OF THE POWER PLANT WESTERN KINGBIRDS AND BLUE GRASSBIRDS.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, THE WESTERN KINGBIRDS HAVE RETURNED TO THE AREA JUST EAST OF DES MOINES WHERE THEY HAVE NESTED AT LEAST THE PAST 5 YEARS. TO LOOK FOR THEM, FROM HIGHWAY #163, GO NORTH ON 70<sup>TH</sup> ST NE .1 MILE TO THE INTERSECTION WITH 12<sup>TH</sup> AVE NE. LOOK AROUND THAT INTERSECTION.

IN SOUTHEAST IOWA AT SWAN LAKE IN JOHNSON COUNTY, DUNLIN, STILT SANDPIPER, WILSON'S PHALAROPE AND WESTERN SANDPIPER ON THE 27<sup>TH</sup>. AT OR NEAR LIVINGSTON TIMBER NORTH OF FAIRFIELD IN JEFFERSON COUNTY, BLACK-BILLED CUCKOO, OLIVE-SIDED FLYCATCHER AND ORCHARD ORIOLE, ON THE 28<sup>TH</sup>. IN DES MOINES COUNTY SOUTH OF BURLINGTON A YELLOW CROWNED NIGHT HERON AND PROTHONOTARY WARBLERS NEAR THE ISU GENERATING PLANT, AND NORTH OF BURLINGTON FORSTER'S TERNS, ALL ON THE 29<sup>TH</sup>. IN LEE COUNTY, FRANKLIN'S GULLS + BLACK TERNS SEEN FROM THE LIMBER LONGER REST AREA ON HIGHWAY #61 JUST NORTH OF MONTRUSE ON THE 29<sup>TH</sup>.
