IN SOUTHWEST IOWA, AT LAKE ANITA STATE PARK SOUTH OF ANITA IN CASS COUNTY, 7 MOUNTAIN BLUEBIRDS WERE STILL PRESENT MARCH 24<sup>TH</sup>. THIS IS FROM A FLOCK OF UP TO 20 BIRDS FIRST OBSERVED IN JANUARY. THESE BIRDS WERE WITH 2 EASTERN BLUEBIRDS ALONG THE LEFT FORK OF THE PARK ROAD, ALSO, AN EARLY COMMON <sup>BOTH</sup> LOON ON THE LAKE. AND AT DESOTO NWR IN HARRISON CO. 14 SPECIES OF GEESE, INCLUDING ROSS ON THE 24<sup>TH</sup>. AND A VERY EARLY BRONZE WINGED HAWK ON THE 24<sup>TH</sup>. + A RUFOUS SIDED TOWHEE AT CARDOON ON THE 28<sup>TH</sup>.

AND AT THE SAYLORVILLE WILDLIFE AREA SOUTH OF LUTHER <sup>UP TO</sup> 5 BALD EAGLES LAST WEEK. AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN MARION COUNTY 19 SPECIES OF WATERFOWL INCLUDING GREATER SCAUP ON MARCH 25 + 26.
