A MIGRATING BLACK-LEGGED KITTLWAKE, AND A PINE GROSBEAK +
TOWNSEND'S SOUTHPIRE IN NW IOWA ARE THE WEEKS
HIGHLIGHTS

ON SATURDAY, DECEMBER 9TH 6 EURASIAN TREE SPARROWS
WERE FOUND IN DES MOINES COUNTY, ^{NEAR DUMBERG LAKE} NORTH OF BURLINGTON.
AT A FEEDER. TO LOOK FOR THESE BIRDS, EXIT HIGHWAY
#99 A MILE NORTH OF BURLINGTON AND JUST BEFORE THE
WATER TREATMENT PLANT AND GO EAST ON TANIA ROAD. EVENTUALLY THE ROAD PARALLELS THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER LEVEE
AND WHEN A LAKE IS SEEN BETWEEN THE ROAD AND LEVEE
GO TO THE NORTH END OF THE LAKE AND ON THE
WEST SIDE OF THE ROAD, LOOK AT THE FEEDER AT THE
STRATTON RESIDENCE ON SUNDAY THE 10TH, 3 BIRDS
WERE SEEN THERE, AND 1 WAS SEEN AT A
FEEDER ON THE SAME SIDE OF THE ROAD ABOUT A
MILE BACK TOWARD HIGHWAY 99. FOR UPDATES OR

AND ALSO IN DES MOINES COUNTY 2 NORTHERN
MOCKINGBIRDS IN SEPARATE LOCATIONS ON THE 9TH.

IN NORTHWEST IOWA, A FEMALE PINE GROSBEAK WAS
SEEN AT OAK GROVE STATE PARK IN SOIAK COUNTY, BUT NO
MORE DETAILS ARE KNOWN. COMMON REDPOLLS HAVE BEEN SEEN
THERE AND AT SOIAK CENTER AND A BROWN-WINGED HAWK WAS
REPORTED FROM SOIAK CENTER ON THE 9TH. A TOWNSEND'S
SOUTHPIRE WITHOUT DETAILS HAS BEEN REPORTED FROM
SIOUX CITY AND THE BROWN THRASHER AT SPENCER
SINCE NOV 26 IS STILL PRESENT. FOR MORE INFO ON ANY

IN ANEW REPORT TODAY, REMEMBER THE SLATE BACKED
 GULL AT THE LEAD CITIES LAST FEBRUARY. WELL, A DARK
 MANTLED GULL ABOUT THE SIZE OF A HERRING WAS
 LOCATED TODAY ON THE ~~MISCELLANEOUS~~^{MISSISSIPPI} AT DAVENPORT. THE
~~GULL WAS SEEN FROM THE OLD YACHT CLUB STATION~~^{LAKE 10TH}
 ON ICE WITH ABOUT A THOUSAND OTHER BIRDS. TO
 GET TO THE YACHT CLUB PARKING LOT, EXIT HIGHWAY
 67 ON ONEIDA STREET TOWARD THE RIVER. A LAND-
 MARK NEAR ONEIDA IS THE WONDER BREAD BAKERY.

AT DAVENPORT, THE DARK MANTLED GULL FIRST

 STATE RECORD. YESTERDAY IT WAS VIEWED FROM THE
 TOWN SIDE FROM THE OLD YACHT CLUB PARKING LOT
 WHICH IS RENDERED BY GOING TOWARD THE RIVER ON
 ONEIDA ST. FLOWS HIGHWAY 67 WHICH IS RIVER DRIVE.
 A LANDMARK NEAR THERE IS THE WONDER BREAD

IN CENTRAL IOWA, NUMEROUS WATERFOWL, INCLUDING A WHITE-WINGED SCOTER OFF THE CREEPY GLEN AREA OF THE SPANAWAUE RESERVOIR IN POLK COUNTY ON THE 9TH AT BIG CREEK STATE PARK, OPEN WATER WITH QUITE A FEW DUCKS AND JUST NORTH OF THE END OF 100 STREET, 2 LONG-EARED OWLS ON THE 9TH. UNITE WINGED CROSSBILLS WERE SEEN AT ^{GREENDALE CENTER} 101 DEADERICKS FROM 101 DEADERICKS TO 101 DEADERICKS ON THE 5TH AND ^{THE RED-TAILLED HAWK} SHOULDERS HAWK, WHOSE WINGS HAS WITNESS THE PAST SEVERAL YEARS EVIDENTLY RETURNED TO THE AREA ALONG HIGHWAY 415 SOUTH OF THE POLK CITY CASUALS GENERAL STORE. IN MADISON COUNTY A FLOCK OF NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD AND A BREWER'S BLACK-BIRDS ON THE 8TH.
