THE BRIEF APPEARANCE OF A TRICOLORED HERON IN SOUTHEAST IOWA HIGHLIGHTS THIS WEEK'S REPORT. ON APRIL 29TH, IOWA'S FIRST TRICOLORED HERON WAS SEEN AT CONE MARCH IN LOMSA COUNTY. IT WAS NEAR THE EAST END OF THE EAST-NEST DIKE. UNFORTUNATELY, ONCE IT FLEW IT WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN DESPITE CONSIDERABLE SPREADING THE REST OF THE WEEKEND.

ALSO AT CONE MARCH THE DRAKE CINNAMON TEAL WAS STILL PRESENT SOUTH OF THE SOUTH ROAD IN THE MOST WESTERLY WATER, AND A COMMON MOORHEN WAS IN THE EASTERN PORTION OF THE MARSH AND ALSO ON APRIL 1, NUMEROUS SNAKEBIRDS ALONG THE EAST-NEST DIKE, AND A KING RAIL JUST NORTH OF THE SOUTH ROAD WHERE A CULVERT GOES UNDER THE ROAD, ON APRIL 29TH. ALSO A WILSON'S PHALAROPE ON APRIL 1 ALONG THE SOUTH ROAD.

The brief appearance of a tri-colored heron in southeast Iowa highlights this week's report. On April 29th, Iowa's first TRI-COLORED HERON was seen at COVE MARSH IN LOMA COUNTY. IT WAS NEAR THE EAST END OF THE EAST-WEST DIKE. UNFORTUNATELY, ONCE IT FLEW IT WAS NOT SEEN AGAIN DESPITE CONSIDERABLE SEARCHING SINCE. ALSO AT COVE MARSH, THE DRAKE CINNAMON TEAL WAS STILL PRESENT THERE MAY 4TH SOUTH OF THE SOUTH ROAD IN THE MOST WESTERLY WATER. A COMMON MOORHEN WAS OBSERVED FROM THE EAST ROAD NEAR SOME DUCK DECOYS ON APRIL 29TH - MAY 3RD. AND ALL WEEK THROUGH THE 4TH, ALONG THE EAST WEST DIKE SCOTT VIRGINIA RAILS AND AMERICAN & LEAST BITTERNS. AND ON THE 3RD A KING RAIL AND A BLACK RAIL. AND BAIRD'S SANDPIPER AND SHORT-BILLED DOWITCHER JUST WEST OF COEVILLE IN A CREEK. (FOR MORE INFO LEAVE NAME & NUMBER)

In other Southeast Iowa reports, at the CORPOLVILLE RESERVOIR IN JOHNSON COUNTY, A SHORT-EARED OWL AT THE END OF THE BABCOCK LAKE ROAD ON THE 3RD; AND AT SWAN LAKE LONG BILLED DOWITCHER, WILSON'S PHALAROPE, AND WILLETS ON THE 28TH. A SWAINSON HAWK ALONG I-80, 16 MILE WEST OF TOWN CITY, ON THE 29TH AND 2 GRAY PARTRIDGE AT THE SOUTHEAST EDGE OF TOWN CITY 1/2 MILE SOUTH OF HIGHWAY 6 ALONG SCOTT BLUFF EXTENSION AND A YELLOW CROWNED NIGHT HERON NEAR THE ISU GENERATING PLANT SOUTH OF BURLINGTON ON THE 3RD. A PINE WARBLER AT THE AMANA NOODS ON THE 3RD.
