THE HARRIS' HAWK, FIRST REPORTED IN BENTON
COUNTY ON SAT. SEPT. 9 HAS BEEN SEEN AT THE
SAME LOCATIONS SEVERAL TIMES SINCE INCLUDING THURS.^{THURS.} SEPT. 14 THE LOCATION IS ^{ALONE COUNTY U.S.G.} 2 1/2
MILES SOUTH OF BLAIRSTOWN AT 1/2 MILE NORTH
OF THE IOWA COUNTY LINE, AROUND A LARGE
BARE FEEDLOT ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE ROAD.
ON FENCEPOSTS, utility poles, around the feedlot.
IT HAS BEEN SEEN, IN A LONE DEAD TREE ABOUT
1/2 MILE EAST OF THE FEEDLOT. THIS BIRD IS
NATIVE TO THE DESERT SOUTHWEST AND HAS NOT BEEN
SEEN IN THE STATE IN MODERN TIMES. HOWEVER,
HARRIS' HAWK IS A FAVORITE OF LICENSED
FALCONERS, SO IT IS POSSIBLE THIS BIRD IS
AN ESCAPEE, WHICH IF TRUE WOULD MAKE IT
UNCONTAINABLE. IT IS NEVERTHELESS A BEAUTIFUL
BIRD TO SEE. ALSO SEEN AT THIS LOCATION ON
THE 10TH WERE NUMEROUS MIGRATING ACCIPITERS
AND A NORTHERN MOCKINGBIRD.

THE ROYAL TERN ^{NORTH OF} BURLINGTON IN
DES MOINES COUNTY HAS NOT BEEN SEEN
SINCE SEPT. 7. HOWEVER, THERE PRESENTLY
A NUMBER OF GOOD BIRDS AT THIS LOCATION
INCLUDING, JUVENILE LAUGHING GULL, 3 RECLINS,
3 SANDERLINS, SNOWY EGRET, 2 HERMIT GULLS,
BLAUL, FORSTER'S, COMMON, YELLOWS, PELICANS,
UP TO 200 GREAT EGRETS, AND OSPREYS. THIS
AREA IS REACHED BY EXITING HIGHWAY 99 NORTH
OF BURLINGTON BETWEEN MILE MARKERS 9410,
THEN GO EAST OF A GRavel ROAD A TOTAL OF
