A GOOD WARBLER MOVEMENT OCCURRED ON SEPT 2, AS 19 SPECIES, INCLUDING, GOLDEN-WINGED, LAPE MARY AND CONNECTICUT WERE SEEN SATURDAY MORNING ALONG THE RACON RIVER SOUTH OF PEACH IN PEACH COUNTY

IN NORTH CENTRAL IOWA IN CERRO GORDO COUNTY, SEVERAL THOUSAND WHITE PELICANS AT VENTURA MARSH AND A PINE WARBLER AT MCINTOSH WOODS STATE PARK.

IN JOHNSON COUNTY A RED SHOULDERED HAWK AT THE CORCONIE RESERVOIR, 2 MILES WEST OF THE DUPONT BRIDGE, GREENCASTLE INTERSECTION

THE SAYLORVILLE LAUNCHING SLUG, FIRST DISCOVERED AT THE RED ROCK RESERVOIR IN ANNEHART COUNTY, ON AUGUST 19TH, WAS STILL PRESENT ON SUNDAY, SEPT 3, WHEN IT WAS SEEN ON A GRAVEL BAR BELOW THE DAM, AND WAS BEST VIEWED FROM TRAILWATER SOUTH. IT HAS ALSO BEEN SEEN AT THE SWIM BEACH AT THE NORTH END OF THE DAM. OTHER ^{SPOTS} BIRDS SEEN AT THE BEACH OR BELOW THE DAM THIS INCLUDE, SANDPEEPING, Ruddy TURNSTONE, WESTERN SANDPIPER, AND WILLET AND ON SEP 2ND A LAST TERN AT THE BEACH

THE PASSERINE MIGRATION IS IN FULL SWING NOW AND THAT ALONG WITH THE CONTINUED PRESENCE OF THE JUVENILE LAUGHING GULL AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR ^{IN MARSHALL COUNTY} ARE THE WEEK'S HIGHLIGHTS. MOST PROMINENT MIGRANTS ^{THIS PAST WEEKEND} INCLUDED WARBLERS, EASTERN KINGBIRDS, NIGHTHAWKS AND SWALLOWS, AS WELL AS THE FIRST REPORT OF BROAD-WINGED HAWK.

~~THE JUVENILE LAUGHING GULL WAS SEEN BY SOME GROUPS AND MISSED BY SOME BOTH SATURDAY AND SUNDAY THE 26TH + 27TH. THE TWO PLACES IT WAS SEEN ARE AT THE SWIM BEACH ABOVE THE ^{RED ROCK} DAM AT THE NORTH END AND ON A GRAVEL BAR BELOW THE DAM. OTHER SHOREBIRDS SEEN AT THE BEACH OR BELOW THE DAM LAST WEEK INCLUDE SANDERLING, WESTERN SAND-PIPER, RUDDY TURNSTONE AND WILLET. ALSO SEEN OVER THE ENTRANCE TO THE SAUSAGE LOGS, I SPOT RUM @ PELX ROCK ON THE 27TH.~~

NEAR INDIANOLA IN S. CENTRAL IOWA, IN ANN JOHNSON'S YARD 14 SPECIES OF WARBLERS AND BROAD-WINGED HAWK ON THE 27TH.

IN CENTRAL IOWA AT LORAMMER GROVE PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, 13 WARBLER SPECIES INCLUDING GOLDEN-WINGED, CANADA, AND BAY-BREASTED PLUS OLIVE-SIDED AND YELLOW-BELLIED FLYCATCHERS ON THE 27TH.
