AREA OF THE SAWMILL RESERVOIR ON SUNDAY  
MORNING, SEPT. 3. AND AN IMMATURE LITTLE BLUE  
HERON WAS AT THE RUMSEY WILDLIFE AREA IN POLK  
COUNTY ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>. AND A YOUNG GOLDFINCH  
TUSCANIS, OR SPARBERLYNS AND A BROWN BREASTED IN

Movement occurred on Sept 2, as 19 species,  
including, Golden-Winged, Cape May and  
Connecticut were seen Saturday morning along  
the Raccoon River south of Perry in Des Moines  
County.

In North Central Iowa in Cerro Gordo  
County, several thousand white pelicans  
at Vinton Marsh and a Pine Warbler  
at Mt. Ida Woods State Park.

In Johnson County, a red Shouldered Hawk  
at the Corcoran Reservoir, 2 miles west  
of the DuPont Bridge, Green Castle inter-  
section.

The Tawny-Legged Duck, first ever  
covered at the Red Rock Reservoir in Marion  
County, on August 19<sup>th</sup>, was still present  
on Sunday, Sept 3, when it was seen  
on a gravel bar below the dam, perhaps  
best viewed from Tailwater South. It  
has also been seen at the swim beach at  
the north end of the dam. Other shorebirds  
seen at the beach or below the dam this  
week, Swamphen, Rusty-Tern, Western  
Sandpiper, and Quail and on Sep 2<sup>nd</sup> a Least Tern at the dam.

In central Iowa at Laramie Grove Park  
in Marshall County, 13 warbler species  
including Golden-winged, Canada, and Bay-breasted  
plus olive-sided and yellow-bellied flycatchers  
on the 27th.

Also, in central Iowa, 2 buff-breasted sandpipers with golden plovers and 8 other shorebird species at the Brenton Farms feedlot on the 26th. This location is found by going south from Grinnell about 1 mile to S T and then east to a large feedlot with 5 pens.

AT THE LEDGES STATE PARK IN BOONE COUNTY, 10 warbler species, including golden winged on the 27th.

In a big day, on Friday the 25th which started at Union Slough NWR in NW Iowa, ~~12~~ <sup>12</sup> ~~19~~ <sup>19</sup> species ended in the Des Moines area, <sup>N</sup> 12 species of shorebirds including a red-necked phalarope at Union Slough and 14 species of warbler.

In Southeast Iowa, 10 warbler species at Croton Unit of Shimer State Forest NW of Decatur in Lee County plus 2 Carolina Wrens and a Broad-winged Hawk at Keokak.
