

BESIDES DIVING DUCKS, OTHER MIGRANTS APPEARED IN THE STATE WITH THE 2 WARM PUSSES OF LAST WEEK. RED WINGED BLACKBIRDS, GRACKLES, AND KILLEDER WERE PROMINENT AT LEAST IN ~~SEVERAL~~  
~~IOWA~~ THE <sup>2<sup>ND</sup></sup> SOUTHERN PART OF THE STATE. ALSO FIRST REPORTS OF TURKEY VULTURES.

MANY OF THE NEWS WAS FROM SOUTHEAST IOWA. IN LEE COUNTY, THOUSANDS OF WATERFOWL AND GULLS ARE ON POOL #19 OF THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER. MOST OF THESE DUCKS ARE STILL COMMON GOLDENEYES, COMMON MEGANSEERS, AND CANVASBACKS, BUT THERE ARE SOME SCAP AND HOODED MEGANSEERS, AND THE FIRST RING NECKED DUCKS WERE REPORTED. MOST OF THE GULLS ARE RING-BILLED WITH SOME HERRINGS. ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup> 2 HORNS CIGGERS IN WINTER PLUMAGE WERE SEEN ALONG THE IOWA SIDE JUST SOUTH OF MONTROSE, AND A PRO SHOULDERED HAWK WAS 5 MILES SOUTH OF MONTROSE. AT STARR'S CAVE PARK NORTH OF BURLINGTON A REYOVER GOLDEN EAGLE WAS SEEN ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>. IN HENRY COUNTY, A LONG EARED OWL AND 4 EARLY TURKEY VULTURES WERE OBSERVED AT GEODE STATE PARK ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup>. WHILE AT COVE MARSH IN LOVELAND COUNTY, AN EARLY LESSER YELLOWLEGS WAS NOTED ON THE 2<sup>ND</sup>. A NORTHERN HARRIER WAS PRESENT ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup>. THERE ARE ALSO QUITE A FEW DUCKS AND GULLS ON THE MISSISSIPPI IN THE DAVENPORT AREA WHERE A FIRST WINTER THAYER'S GULL WAS SEEN FROM THE MOUNE, ILLINOIS WATERFRONT ON THE 28<sup>TH</sup>.

IN THE NORTHWEST, WE HAVE HAD NO NEW INFORMATION ON THE TOWNSEND'S SOLITAIRE IN EASTERN WOODBURY COUNTY, BUT SUSPECT IT WOULD STILL BE AROUND. IT WAS DISCOVERED ON THE 23<sup>RD</sup> AT HICKORY HILLS PUBLIC HUNTING AREA A MILE AND A HALF SOUTH OF CORRECTIONSVILLE. FOR MORE INFORMATION, CALL BILL KAISER AT (702) 499-1657

IN THE NORTHEAST, THE WHITE WINGED CROSSBILL HAS NOT RETURNED TO CAROLYN FISCHER FEEDER IN NORTHWEST MARSH CITY SINCE THE 23<sup>RD</sup>, BUT ON THE 26<sup>TH</sup>, SHE DISCOVERED A NORTHERN SAW WHET OWL IN A DECIDUOUS WOODS BEHIND HER HOUSE.

IN THE SOUTH CENTRAL, BETH BROWN OF OSCARLAKE BANDED 250 PURPLE FINCHES IN HER YARD SINCE JANUARY 6<sup>TH</sup>.

IN CENTRAL TEXAS, THE 2 TRUMPETER SWANS IN STOKE COUNTY WERE STILL PRESENT ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup> WHEN THEY WERE SEEN AT HENDERICKSON MARSH. IN HARRIS AND MARSHALL COUNTIES, SEVERAL LARGE FLOCKS OF LAPLAND LONGSPURS WERE NOTED ON FEB 26<sup>TH</sup> AND MARCH 3<sup>RD</sup>.
