

THERE ARE NO NEW GOOD BIRDS REPORTED, BUT MANY OF THE PREVIOUSLY SEEN ~~ONES~~ WERE STILL PRESENT THIS PAST WEEK.

IN NORTHWEST Iowa, THE SANDHILL CRANE PREVIOUSLY REPORTED BEFORE CHRISTMAS IS STILL PRESENT WITH A FLOCK OF CANADA GEESE AT BLACKHAWK LAKE IN SAC COUNTY.

IN WESTERN IOWA AT PELTON NWR, MANY GEESE ARE STILL PRESENT BUT MOST ARE NOT NOW VISIBLE FROM THE VISITOR'S CENTER. THE BRENT AND BARROW'S GOLDENEYE WERE NOT ~~REPORTED~~ THIS PAST WEEK, AND MAY BE GONE.

IN CENTRAL IOWA, THE VARIED THRUSH WHICH HAS BEEN IN A DES MOINES YARD FOR 6 WEEKS WAS STILL PRESENT THROUGH THE 15TH. FOR FURTHER DIRECTIONS TO SEE THIS BIRD PLEASE LEAVE YOUR NAME AND PHONE NUMBER AFTER THIS REPORT. THE 2 TRUMPETER SWANS WERE STILL DOWN-STREAM FROM THE SE 14TH ST BRIDGE ON THE 14TH. ALSO IN DES MOINES AT GLENDALE CEMETERY ON THE 15TH, A FLOCK OF PINE SISKINS, HOUSE FINCHES + 1 WHITE-WHITE CROWNED SPARROW. AT SAYWARDVILLE, A MALE OLD-SCHOOL ^{ON THE 15TH IN OPEN WATER} OFF OF THE CHERRY GLEN ACCESS ON THE 15TH AND A GLaucous GULL SEEN FROM THE MILE LONG BRIDGE AT

THE CROSSBILL WAS STILL PRESENT IN A TREE ABOVE A SMALL SIDE SECTION D IN THE MASONIC PART OF THE CEMETERY. TO REACH THIS AREA TAKE 3 RIGHTS, INCLUDING, JUST INSIDE THE ENTRANCE WHICH IS OFF UNIVERSITY AVE AT ABOUT 49TH. TO LOCATE THE CROSSBILL, YOU MIGHT TRY LISTENING FOR THE SKINS.
