HIGHLIGHTS THIS WEEK INCLUDE BARRON'S GOLDENEYE AND BRANT AT DESOTO NWR AND VARRIED THRUSH IN DES MOINES

AT DESOTO NWR IN HARRISON COUNTY IN EXTREME WESTERN IOWA, THE MALE BARRON'S GOLDENEYE AND THE BRANT WERE SEEN FROM THE VISITOR'S CENTER. THE BRANT WAS REPORTED ON JAN 4TH AND THE GOLDENEYE THE 6TH. FOR UPDATES YOU MIGHT CALL THE REFUGE AT (712) 642-2141. THERE ARE STILL 150,000 GEESE, MOSTLY SNOWS AND A VARIETY OF DUCKS STILL PRESENT.

IN DES MOINES, A VARRIED THRUSH HAS BEEN IN THE YARD AND UNDER A FEEDER AT THE HOME OF THE J.C. ENSIGTS, 147 34TH ST. ^{FOR OVER A MONTH} IF YOU WANT TO SEE THIS BIRD, PLEASE CALL THE ENSIGTS AT (515) 255-7319 AND ARRANGE A TIME CONVENIENT FOR THEM. THERE ARE ALSO DOZENS OF ROBINS AND SOME RED BREASTED NUTHATCHES IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD. ALSO IN DES MOINES, THE 2 TRUMPETER SWANS WERE DOWNSTREAM FROM THE SE 14TH ST. BRIDGE ON JAN 7TH.
