CONDUCTED ON THE 18TH. THE TAMMICA COURT IN  
LUTHERS COUNTY HAD A RECORD TOTAL OF 63 SPECIES  
WITH 2 NORTHERN COOHAWKS AND A SANDALWOOD CREEPER  
IN WITH THE GEESE AT BOB'S BRANCH. AND THE ALGONA  
COURT IN KOSUTH COUNTY CAME UP WITH 41 SPECIES  
INCLUDING CAROLINA WREN, BREWER'S BLACKBIRD AND OVER

400 PHEASANTS.

IN THE NORTHWEST, A VARIED THRUSH HAD BEEN AT A FEEDER IN SPENCER, CRAW COUNTY SINCE NOV 26<sup>TH</sup>. THIS WAS AT THE HOME OF JIM BOCK, 814 W. 10<sup>TH</sup>, WHOM YOU MAY CALL FOR UPDATES AT (712) 262-6579.

AND IN NORTHERN LINN COUNTY, A GROUP OF SHORT EARED OWLS WAS BEING SEEN LAST WEEK BY GOING EAST FROM CENTER POINT ON COUNTY ROAD E-16 FOR 1 MILE, THEN NORTH ON GRAVEL 2 MILES, AND BACK WEST ON GRAVEL WHERE YOU LOOK FOR THE BIRDS.
