SEEN AGAIN ON MURRAY THE 25TH AT THE WEST END OF CREDIT
WAS NOT RECORDED AMONG THE SEVERAL THOUSAND GULLS
HERE. THE GULLS GATHER ON THE HARBOR BETWEEN
CREDIT ISLAND AND THE TOWN SHIP, ALSO AROUND CREDIT ISLAND
VIEWED, DEPENDING ON THE TIME OF DAY, FROM THE
WEST END OF CREDIT ISLAND OR ALONG CONCORD
STREET, BOTH OF WHICH CAN BE REACHED FROM US
HIGHWAY 61 IN THE WEST PART OF DRAVENPORT. THERE
IS ALSO A FIRST WINTER THAYER'S GULL IN THE AREA

CROSSBILLS WERE AT CEDAR MEMORIAL CEMETERY

AN INVASION OF WHITE-TAILED CROSSBILLS INTO SOUTHERN MINNESOTA HAS BEGUN TO REACH TOWN IF THE 7 REPORTS THIS PAST 2 WEEKS IS ANY INDICATION. IN THE MOST LATEST REPORTS, ^{1 MILE FROM CENTRAL TOWN} 5 WERE SEEN AT THE DODGE COUNTY CONSERVATION BOARD'S VISITOR'S CENTER 1/2 MILE SOUTH OF PEPPER ON THE 17TH, AND ON SATURDAY THE 18TH, A FLOCK ^{OF 8-10} WAS SEEN AT CLEMENCE CEMETERY #87TH AND UNIVERSITY IN DES MOINES, AND 2 WERE AT BANGOR CEMETERY 6 MILES WEST OF LITCHFIELD IN MARSHALL COUNTY ON THE 19TH. ^{AND 9 AT 340 MILE LINE IN MARSHALL COUNTY} LOOK FOR THEM IN HEMLOCKS.
