Welcome to an update

The winter adult slate-backed gull was seen all day Thursday Feb 16 along River Drive & in Moline Illinois, just after a little up river from where it was discovered on Tuesday. To search this area for ~~January~~ from Dr. H. R. Ron on I-74 + get off at the first Illinois exit which is 3<sup>rd</sup> ave. The exit ramp take you onto the interstate then turn right & follow river down ~~up~~ to look for the gull between the Jubilee Rest & the J-I Case plant. On Tuesday it was most often seen near the John Deere Tech Center & ~~Thomas~~. Today it was usually seen near the Marina, which is closer to the case plant. There are a series of parks along river down & from what to look. On Wednesday the gull was ~~also~~ found several miles upstream <sup>about 6-7 miles</sup> just North of Leelanau on the Iowa side. Leelanau or east by gull now <sup>about 10 miles</sup> on 67 from I-80 exit 306 - the last one on Iowa also LTO.

IN NORTHEAST IOWA, A COMMON REDPOLL HAS  
BEEN COMING TO THE FEEDER OF DORIS DEEN  
IN CENTRAL CITY, LINN COUNTY. TO LOOK FOR  
THIS BIRD FROM HIGHWAY #13 AT CENTRAL CITY,  
GO EAST ON COUNTY ROAD E-16 A FEW  
BLOCKS, AND THEN TURN RIGHT (OR SOUTH) ON  
RIVER STREET WHICH IS JUST BEFORE YOU GET TO  
THE WAPESANICON RIVER BRIDGE. PARK IN FRONT  
OF THE SECOND HOME ON THE RIGHT AND WATCH  
THE THISTLE FEEDER. MORNING IS BEST. YOU
