THIS AREA IS NW OF ARGYLE, AND IS REACHED BY GOING WEST FROM THAT TOWN A TOTAL OF 3.1 MILES, INCLUDING A RIGHT AT THE 4 INTERSECTION. THEN PARK AND ENTER THE WOODS TO THE EAST JUST BEFORE A SMALL BRIDGE.

And on up the same road Blue Grosbeaks AT THE Turkey Run Dam River Access AND 1.1 miles toward Crotor from that access



HABITAT IS VIRGIN LAKE SOUTH OF RUTHEREN IN PAO
AUTO COUNTY WHERE, THERE WERE ABOUT THE SAME MIX
OF BIRDS ^{ON THE 16TH}, AS AT UNION SLOUGH, NEAR 12 MILE LAKE IN
EMMETT COUNTY, AS UPLAND SANDPIPER AND AT DESS.
