

THE JOE FIELD TRIP TO RED ROCK RESERVOIR WHICH WAS CALLED OFF DUE TO THE WEATHER ON NOVEMBER 23RD HAS BEEN RESCHEDULED FOR SATURDAY, DECEMBER 7TH. MEET AT THE VISITOR'S CENTER AT THE SOUTH END OF THE DAM AT 8 AM

① ON THE 28TH, THE LITTLE BLACK BACKED GULL, ^{ADULT} AT THE CHARLOTTE RESERVOIR, ^{ON THE 20TH} WAS RELOCATED TODAY OUT FROM THE PARKING LOT ALONG JOHNSON COUNTY ROAD F-20 NEAR THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE HAWKHEAD WILDLIFE AREA. AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR, AN ^{ADULT} WHITE SWAN WAS AT THE NORTH END OF THE LAKE ABOVE THE DAM. THE SECOND WINTER THAYER'S GULL WAS ^{STILL} BELOW THE DAM AND A CAROLINA WREN WAS NEAR THE RANGERS HOUSE AT NORTH FUR ROCK STATE PARK.

④ ON THE 25TH IN JOHNSON COUNTY A LATE BROWN THRASHER WAS SEEN ALONG THE ENTRANCE ROAD OF THE MACBride NATURE CENTER AND AN ADULT PERRINE FALCON WAS SPOTTED CHASING PIGEONS IN DOWNTOWN KEOKUK

ON THE 27TH ③ AT RED ROCK RESERVOIR ~~AREA~~, AN OLDSQUAN AND SEVERAL WHITE WINGED SCOTERS WERE SEEN JUST EAST OF WHITEBREST POINT AND BELOW THE DAM. 5 GULL SPECIES, INCLUDING A SECOND WINTER THAYER'S, A PRYORVILLE AND 6 ROYALTY, PLUS AN IMMATURE TUNDRA SWAN.

② ~~AND~~ IN THE NORTHWEST, A NORTHERN SPAN WHEAT OWL WAS FOUND AT OAK GROVE PARK IN WESTERN SPOON COUNTY AND A MERLIN WAS SPOTTED 2 MILES NORTH OF HAWARDEN, AND THE MERLIN IN THE TOWN OF SPOON CENTER IS STILL BEING SEEN

This week we have reports of WHITE-WINGED SCOTER, OLDSQUAW,
and GLAUCOUS, THAYER'S and LESSER BLACK-BACKED GULLS.

In the south-central at Red Rock Reservoir in Marion County,
on the 24th, three WHITE-WINGED SCOTERS and an OLDSQUAW were
all in one field of view just off the Roberts Creek Lake dam
on the Red Rock side of the lake. Below the dam, an adult
GLAUCOUS GULL, an adult THAYER'S GULL, and a first year
THAYER'S GULL, plus a late BLACK BELLIED PLOVER were all
present on the 24th.

In the southeast, a dark mantled gull, probably a LESSER
BLACK-BACKED, was with a group of gulls sitting on the water
of the Coralville Reservoir, as seen from the Jolly Roger
area, about 3 miles north of North Liberty on the 24th. The
LAPLAND LONGSPUR flock has been in the same field now for
over three weeks. This location is on the north side of
county road F-28, about three-quarters of a mile west of
I-380. On the 20th, flocks of both SNOW BUNTINGS and
LAPLAND LONGSPURS were in the Green Bay bottoms area of Lee
County east of Wever. In Henry County, a HORNERED GREBE and a
COMMON LOON were at Geode State Park on the 20th. The
WHITE-WINGED SCOTER on the Iowa River at Iowa City has not
been reported since the 21st.

24th.

In the northwest, a pitch black dark phased ROUGH LEGGED
HAWK was seen in Sioux County this past week, and Jon Van
Dyk of Sioux Center has had a RED BREASTED NUTHATCH at his
feeder. In Ida County, eight COMMON REDPOLLS were seen at
Moorhead Park near Ida Gorge on the 18th.
