BUT IN THE AFTERNOON THEY WERE SIGHTED ~~ALONG RIVER DRIVE~~<sup>from</sup>  
THE PARKWAY, IN MOLINE FIRST NEAR 32<sup>N2</sup>  
STREET AND LATER JUST UPSTREAM FROM THE TABEREE  
RESTAURANT. THE FIRST AREA - - - - -

ON ~~TODAY~~ THE 15<sup>TH</sup>, A FEMALE WHITE WINGED SCOTER  
WAS OBSERVED AT CEDAR LAKE IN CEDAR RAPIDS.  
THIS AREA CAN BE SEEN FROM I-380, AND IS  
REACHED BY TAKING THE H AND J STREETS EXIT.

IN THE AFTERNOON, BOTH BIRDS WERE AGAIN SEEN IN BOTH IOWA AND ILLINOIS FROM THE PARKWAY ALONG RIVER DRIVE IN MOLINE NEAR 32ND STREET, AND LATER JUST UPSTREAM FROM THE SABINE'S GULLS.

The migration continues. Most warblers have now departed the state, except for YELLOW RUMPED, but a BLACKPOLL was seen on the 13th. Kinglets and sparrows are numerous, and ducks are beginning to push into the state.

(D) ~~AN ADULT AND A JUVENILE~~  
In news from Davenport, two SABINE'S GULLS were reported by Richard Pizer of Glenn Ellyn, Illinois. They were on the breakwater just downstream from where the President floating casino docks until dark on the 13th. One juvenile was relocated a little farther downstream near the John O'Donnell Stadium the morning of the 14th. This would be a second state record.

The GROOVE BILLED ANI discovered by Chuck Fuller just north of Burlington on the 5th was never relocated despite intense searching. That bird represents a potential second or third state record.

In the northwest, two WESTERN GREBES were present at Trumbull Lake in eastern Clay Co. on the 12th. There were also 3 lingering WHITE PELICANS. For more information, call Lee Schoenewe at (712)262-8194.

In the central, an interesting sighting from Jim Dinsmore at Ames. An immature NORTHERN GOSHAWK was being pursued by crows and flew through a glass window onto a porch at the home of Mary Buck. It was released outside and flew away, seemingly no worse for the adventure. Also in Story Co., at Hickory Grove Park there were still five shorebird species, including SOLITARY and WESTERN SANDPIPER, and LONG BILLED DOWITCHER on the 15th. In the Red Rock area, at Pictured

Bottoms, a LAPLAND LONGSPUR was seen on the 12th. ~~PARK IN MARSHALL COUNTY, 5 WINTER AND 2 RECENT THRUFARES NOT FOUND OF THE 9TH~~

In the southeast, about a dozen EURASIAN TREE SPARROWS have been hanging out in their usual location north of Burlington. For directions, call Chuck Fuller at (319)753-0710. At Fairfield, Diane Porter saw 4000 CHIMNEY SWIS enter the high school building chimney on the 7th, but none on the 8th. Jim Fuller (319)338-3561
